

## Minutes of December 23rd, 1913

A Regular Adjourned meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Tuesday evening, December 23rd, 1913 at 8:30 o'clock P. M.  
 Present: Trustees Wilson, Crisp, Kemp, Whitaker and Schrader.  
 Absent: None.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with.

A petition from the Redwood Road Improvement Club in reference to a sewer on that street was referred to Trustee Whitaker with directions to see if he could not prevail on the residents to have the work done by private contract instead of carrying it through the course of the "Improvement Act of 1911".

A Communication from the Town of Ross asking permission to trim trees on Bolinas Avenue, was granted.

A letter was received from the Marin Rock Company asking for an extension of time on their contract for the improvement of Tunstead Avenue. On motion of Trustee Crisp, seconded by Trustee Wilson, they were granted an extension of thirty days.

Another communication from the Marin Rock Company in reference to their Blasting Bond was referred to the Town Attorney.

This being the time for opening bids for the Grading and Macadamizing of a portion of San Anselmo Avenue, between Pine Street and Ross Avenue, the Clerk was directed to open and read the only bid received, which was as follows:

"For all the work as specified....."	\$932.00
For broken rock delivered on the Roadway-per cubic yard.....	2.20
For spreading and rolling rock on Roadway- per square foot... ..	.01
Certified check enclosed for \$95.00" <i>signed Louis W. Park, Inc.</i>	

On motion of Trustee Crisp, seconded by Trustee Wilson,

the bid was rejected and the Clerk directed to return the certified check enclosed with the bid.

An ordinance "Prohibiting the Maintenance and Accumulation of Rubbish on Vacant Lots" was given its second reading and adopted by the following vote: Ayes: Trustees Wilson, Crisp, Kemp, Whitaker and Schrader. Noes None Absent None.

Trustee Wilson, after explaining that Ordinance No. 112 had been misconstrued in its intent by the business men of the Town, moved that the matter be turned over to the Town Attorney to straighten out. Seconded by Trustee Crisp and Carried.

*On Motion of Trustee Crisp seconded by Trustee Wilson the time for opening bids for concrete sidewalks in front of the Town Hall was extended to Jan. 17, 1914.*

Applications for Liquor Licenses from E. Chirone, G. Borello, San Anselmo Merchandise Co., Ida Trigon, J. Cazeaux & Co., I. J. Hall, Grosjean & Co., Vonderheide and Mingst, D. Antoni, D. Anatsitos, and Mary A. Wynne were read by the Clerk.

A communication and accompanying affidavit from the California Anti-Saloon League was then read by the Clerk. It appearing from this affidavit that Mr. Chirone of the Coppa Villa had abused his liquor privelege, on motion of Trustee Crisp, seconded by Trustee Whitaker, his application was denied, and all the others granted. The Clerk was directed ot have Mr. Chirone appear before the Board on Monday evening, December 29th, 1913 for a hearing.

On motion of Trustee Crisp, seconded by Trustee Wilson, the Clerk was directed to communicate with the Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company and request permission to construct a drainage culvert under their right of way at Bolinas Avenue.

On motion duly seconded the meeting was then adjourned to Monday evening, December 29th, 1913 at 8:30 P. M.
