

Minutes of November 2nd, 1914

The Regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening, November 2nd, 1914 at 8:00 o'clock P.M.

Present; Trustees Atthowe, Crisp, Hall, Schrader and Kemp. Absent Nohe.

The minutes of the meetings of October 5th and October 27th, 1914 were read and approved.

Liquor Applications

An application for renewal of Liquor license was received from E. Chirone, and upon motion of Trustee Crisp, seconded by Trustee Atthowe, same was renewed until January 1st, 1915 at which time the new ordinance will go into effect.

4th of July Committee

No report having been received from the 4th of July committee, they were granted until the next meeting to render their report.

The Building and Fire Committee was directed to take care of the Dance Platform and protect it during the winter.

Redwood-Road-Floribel Sewer.

On motion of Trustee Hall, seconded by Trustee Crisp, the matter of the Redwood Road and Floribel sewer was referred to the Sanitary Committee to report back at the next regular meeting.

Railroad Crossings & Yolanda Drain.

Trustee Hall reported that Mr. Palmer has written the Marin County Real Estate Board to the effect that all crossings would be protected, and that they were experimenting at the present time on a system.

Trustee Atthowe reported that he had waited on the Railroad officials and that they requested him to have a letter written from the Board, stating just what they desired and it would be given due attention. The Clerk was directed to write the required letter and to also embody the matter of the drainage at Yolanda in the letter.

Butterfield Road-Melville Ave. Water Mains

Trustee Hall reported that the Water Company would not install any more water mains unless required to do so by the Railroad Commission. The Town Attorney was directed to take the matter up with the Railroad Commission and endeavor to have them force the Water Company to lay these mains and also the main

required in the Barber Tract for a Fire Hydrant.

Street Committee's Report

The Street Committee recommended that the Clerk answer the letter of Mrs. Moffits in reference to Olive Avenue and state that if the property owners would help defray the expense of draining this street by paying one half the cost of such drain, the Town would fix the Street.

Several Bridges were reported repaired and the Gutters about Town cleaned out.

The Committee asked power to act in the matter of the drain at Yolanda .

On motion of Trustee Atthowe, seconded by Trustee Schrader the report was accepted and the Committee given the power to act as requested.

Reports

Reports from the Marshal and Building Inspector were read and ordered filed.

Liquor Ordinances

An Ordinance regulating the sale or dispensation of Intoxicating Liquors in the Town of San Anselmo by imposing a fine, penalty or forfeiture of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars for a breach of said Ordinance, was given its second reading and adopted by the following vote:

Ayes, Trustees Atthowe, Crisp, Hall and Kemp.

Noes, Trustee Schrader. Absent None.

An ordinance declaring all places where intoxicating liquors are sold without a license to be a Public Nuisance and providing for the abatement of said nuisances, was given its second reading and adopted by the following vote:

Ayes, Trustees Atthowe, Crisp, Hall and Kemp.

Noes, Trustee Schrader. Absent None.

Complaint by Dr. Scott

Dr. Scott complained that a Chicken House was being maintained on premises adjoining his, that was a menace to Health. The Clerk was directed to call the attention of the Health Officer to the matter and have him report back to the Board at the next meeting.
