

The Regular Adjourned meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening, March 15th, 1915 at 8:00 o'clock P. M.

Absent, None.

The minutes of the meeting of March 1st, 1915 were read and approved.

Liquor Application

The application for a Liquor License from C. E. Thomas, was laid over until the next regular meeting, there being no one present to represent Mr. Thomas.

City Planning Lecture

A letter was received from Mr. Cheney stating that he would be willing to lecture in San Anselmo on March 26th or any night of the week following. Trustees Hall and Schrader were appointed as a committee to make arrangements with Mr. Cheney for the lecture.

Tree Planting

A request from the Woman's Improvement Club for permission to plant Acacia Trees in rear of the Town Hall was referred to the Building and Fire Committee.

Bond of S. J. Norton.--Street Railway Franchise

On motion of Trustee Hall, seconded by Trustee Schrader the Bond of S. J. Norton in the matter of the Street Railway franchise was ordered returned to the Bonding Company.

Improvement of San Anselmo Ave, Woodland Ave, etc.

A resolution was offered by Trustee Crisp, adopting the Plans and Specifications as presented by the Town Engineer, for the Improvement of San Anselmo Avenue, Woodland Avenue, Pine Street and Cedar Street. On motion duly seconded, the Resolution as offered was adopted by the following vote:

Resolution of Intention No. 10.

A Resolution of Intention to order the Improvement of the above mentioned Streets and Avenues and setting forth the district to be assessed for such improvement, was then offered by Trustee Crisp and upon motion duly seconded, the said Resolution was adopted by the following vote:

Ordinances

An Ordinance requiring barriers and lights on dangerous obstructions on the Public Streets, was given its first reading.

An Ordinance prohibiting the discharge or firing of Fireworks or other pyrotechnic display and to limit their storage, was given its first reading.

Donation- Marin Central Chamber of Commerce.

On motion of Trustee Atthowe, seconded by Trustee Crisp, the Board agreed to donate \$10.00 per month towards the Marin Central Chamber of Commerce.

Arroyo Avenue, Short Ranch

On motion of Trustee Crisp, seconded by Trustee Schrader, the Street committee was authorized to have rock hauled from the Croker Quarry in the Short Ranch to Arroyo Avenue, the expense not to exceed \$20.00
