

Minutes of April 2nd, 1917

The Regular Monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening, April 2nd, 1917 at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present, Trustees Kemp, Perry, Redpath, Latham and Atthowe.
Absent, None.

The minutes of the meeting of March 19th were read and approved.

Communications

A letter from Mr. E. A. Brooks in reference to sanitary conditions at the Marin Rock Company's quarry was referred to Trustee Latham and the Health Officer.

A letter from Senator Sharkey in reference to the Rifle Range being moved from Marin County was referred to the Chamber of Commerce.

A letter from G. J. Rambo in reference to experting the Town Books was ordered filed.

A letter from the Central Marin Chamber of Commerce calling attention to violations of the Milk Laws, was referred to the Health Officer.

Reports

Chief Cartwright rendered a very complete report of the past years work of the Fire Department with recommendations. After being read by the Clerk it was ordered filed for reference.

Reports from the Building Inspector, Electrical Inspector, Marshal, Chief Cartwright on the Tennis Court were read and ordered filed.

The Town Engineer reported that the Railroad Company was working on the Lansdale Bridge plans.

Ordinances.

An Ordinance "Regulating the Cutting, Opening and Excavating of Streets in the Town of San Anselmo", an ordinance "Amending Section 3 of Ordinance No. 75" and an ordinance "Repealing Ordinances Nos. 28, 34, 41, 55, 58, 59, 80, 83, 91, 94, 103 and 123" were given a second reading and upon Roll Call were unanimously adopted by the Board. The Clerk was directed to transcribe these ordinances on the ordinance book and post them as required by law.

Legislative enactments.

Town Attorney Locke addressed the Board in reference to Bills in the Legislature, one in reference to having the offices of Marshal and Recorder elective, and one requiring the publication of all ordinances in a newspaper. On motion of Trustee Kemp, seconded by Trustee Perry, the Chairman was authorized to send a telegram to the representatives of the District at Sacramento, expressing the views of the Board on these bills.
