

MINUTES OF APRIL 1ST, 1918.

The Regular Monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening April 1st, 1918 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present, Trustees Kemp, Perry, Latham and Taylor
Absent, " Reeve.

The minutes of the meeting of March 11th, 1918 were read and approved.

Communications

A letter from the Woman's Improvement Club in reference to Spring Planting was referred to the Clerk to answer, with instructions to inform the writers that the movement would have the moral support of the Trustees, and that the Lot used had already been plowed and prepared under the direction of the Town Manager. Any money spent by the Town, however, being the taxpayer's money, should be reimbursed from the proceeds of sales.

A letter from Mr. W. J. Dedrick in reference to reduction of rates for printing Town Ordinances was referred to the Town Manager.

Liquor License --M. & M. Grocery

A petition for a transfer of Liquor License, on account of the sale of the business of the M. & M. Grocery to T. P. and F. M. Hall, was read and laid over until the next meeting.

Reports

Reports were received from the Deputy Marshal on lights out during the month; from the Fire Chief for the past month, from the Building Inspector and from the Town Manager. On motion duly seconded, the reports were ordered filed.

Salary of Town Manager

Upon motion of Trustee Latham, seconded by Trustee Kemp, the motion made at the meeting of March 4th, 1918 in which the salary of the Town Manager was fixed at \$100.00 per month, was rescinded.

Thereupon upon motion of Trustee Latham, seconded by Trustee Perry, the salary of the Town Manager was fixed at \$50.00 per month, commencing April 1st, 1918.

Representative to National Defense Society

A letter from the Woman's Improvement Club, recommending the name of Mrs. Gertrude Lynch, be forwarded to the Woman's Committee of the National Defence Society as a representative from San Anselmo, was read by the Clerk. Upon motion of Trustee Kemp, seconded by Trustee Latham, the Chairman of the Board was instructed to use his own judgment in the picking of a representative Woman from San Anselmo as its representative on this body.
