

MINUTES OF MAY 24th, 1920

A Regular Adjourned meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening, May 24th, 1920 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present, Trustees Linnell, Hund, Thomas and Pinkham.
Absent, Trustee Stephenson.

The minutes of the meeting of May 18th, 1920 were read and approved.

YOLANDA COURT ROADS

A petition signed by 21 property owners in Yolanda Court, requesting the Board to take steps under the Improvement Act of 1911 to improve the roads in Yolanda Court at the time the Board does its general road work, was read and upon motion duly seconded, was laid over until the Board takes up the other road work.

BOND ELECTION

The Ordinance introduced at the last meeting, entitled "An Ordinance calling and providing for a Special Election to be held in the Town of San Anselmo, Marin County, State of California, on the 12th day of June, 1920, to submit to the qualified voters of said Town the proposition of incurring a bonded debt by said Town for the purpose of paying for certain street work in said Town." was given a second reading by the Clerk and upon roll call was passed and adopted by the following vote:

The ordinance was thereupon approved by the President of the Board and duly attested by the Clerk.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL

Mr. Breck took up the matter of Garbage disposal with the Board and complained of the charges ~~made~~ and discrimination made by Garbage men. The matter was referred to the Sanitary and Police Committee, and to the Town Attorney.

SHED IN FIRE LIMITS

A complaint was made to the Board in reference to a shed built by the Chinese who occupied the Arata Building, being built in violation of the Building Ordinance. Upon motion of Trustee Hund, seconded by Trustee Linnell, the Marshal was instructed to notify the owner to tear down the shed and if he desired to re-build, inform him that he must obtain a permit and comply with the building ordinance.

TYPEWRITER

Upon motion of Trustee Hund, seconded by Trustee Linnell, the Finance Committee was authorized to purchase an 18 inch carriage Under-

wood Typewriter at a cost not to exceed One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

Upon motion of Trustee Thomas, seconded by Trustee Hund, the following demands were ordered paid by warrants drawn on the Treasurer:

STREET LIGHTS

A letter from Leonard Morse requesting the Board to place a light on pole No. 1751 was referred to the Street Committee.

REPORTS

Reports were received, read and ordered filed from the Fire Chief, Marshal, Tax Collector and Building Inspector.

A request from the Fire Chief that the Town furnish the oil and gasoline used by him in his own car while said car is used for Town purposes, was upon motion of Trustee Hund, seconded by Trustee Stephenson granted.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL

The Town Attorney made a report as to the powers of the Board in reference to Garbage disposal. The Clerk was thereupon instructed to communicate with the Scavengers operating in San Anselmo and request them to appear before the Board on June 14th, 1920, at 8 o'clock P. M.

SALE OF TANK LOT

Trustee Stephenson reported that Mrs. Larney had stated to him that she would like to purchase another 10 feet adjoining the 20 foot strip bought by her in the San Anselmo Tank lot near Yolanda. Upon motion duly seconded, the matter was referred to the Street Committee.

TAMALPAIS AVENUE BRIDGE

A petition signed by numerous property owners and business men

requesting the Board under no circumstances to allow the Bridge and roadway at the end of Tamalpias Avenue, through the Railroad property to be closed up, was read by the Clerk and referred to the Street Committee. The Town Engineer was instructed to have the Railroad Company make a report as to what they propose to do in this matter by June 21st, 1920.

EUCALYPTUS TREES

This being the time set for hearing petitions for and against the removal of row of Eucalyptus trees near Yolanda and it appearing that some of those opposing the removal had not been notified, the matter was continued to June 21st, 1920 and the Clerk directed to have all signers of the different petitions notified of said hearing.
