

MINUTES OF JUNE 21st, 1920.

A Regular Adjourned meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening, June 21st, 1920 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present: Trustees Hund, Linnell, Stephenson, Thomas and Pinkham.

Absent, None.

The minutes of the meeting of June 14th, 1920 were read and approved.

COMMUNICATIONS

A Letter from A. C. Sylvester asking that when the culvert in front of her property was re-installed, to have it placed in a slightly different position so the water would not run in front of her steps, was referred to the Street Committee.

Letters from Mrs. Hutton and from N. R. Christie in reference to street lights were referred to the Street Committee.

A Letter from Wilkin's Post-American Legion extending an invitation to the Board of Trustees to co-operate with them in the 4th of July celebration was referred to the Clerk with instructions to inform them that inasmuch as San Anselmo was celebrating the 4th also, that they felt in duty bound to use all their efforts to make this Town's celebration a success.

BOND ORDINANCE

Trustee Hund introduced "an ordinance Providing for the issuance of Municipal Bonds of the Town of San Anselmo, in the sum of Ninety-five (\$95,000.00) Thousand Dollars to pay the cost of certain street work".

This ordinance was read by the Clerk and upon motion of Trustee Linnell, seconded by Trustee Thomas, was laid over until the next meeting for final reading and adoption.

#### SCAVENGER MATTER

Trustee Thomas reported that the matter of rates, territory, etc proposed by the Scavengers operating in San Anselmo had been referred to the Town Attorney and asked that the matter be continued until the next meeting.

#### EUCALYPTUS TREES

This being the time fixed for the hearing upon the matter of removing the row of Eucalyptus trees near Yolanda Station, the Board proceeded to hear arguments from both sides, and representatives from both sides having argued their respective views, and letters having been read upon motion of Trustee Hund, seconded by Trustee Stephenson, the matter was taken under advisement, with the understanding that the Board would decide the matter within a month.

#### YOLANDA COURT IMPROVEMENT

Trustee Linnell introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption, to-wit:

RESOLVED, that the Engineer of the Town of San Anselmo be and he is hereby ordered to prepare Plans and Specifications for the following work to be done and improvement to be made in said Town to-wit:

That Laurel Road and Yolanda Drive in Yolanda Court be improved, by grading and paving same and installing necessary drainage appurtenances.

The motion to adopt said resolution was seconded by Trustee Thomas, and carried by the following vote:

#### PLUMBING INSPECTION

Upon motion duly seconded, the Clerk was directed to write to the Plumbers doing business in San Anselmo and request them to appear before the Board on next Monday evening in reference to appointment of a Plumbing Inspector and framing a Plumbing Ordinance.

#### RAILROAD SPUR TRACK-(LUMBER YARD)

Complaint having been made as to the condition of the spur track crossing on San Anselmo Avenue opposite the old E.K. Wood Lumber Yard, the matter was referred to the Clerk with instructions to write to the E. K. Wood Lumber Co., and request them to put this crossing in proper shape so as not to be dangerous to traffic.

ORDINANCE OF ISSUE---BONDS
