

MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 7th, 1920

The Regular Monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Tuesday evening, September 7th, 1920 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present, Trustees Linnell, Hund, Stephenson, Thomas and Pinkham.
Absent, " None.

The minutes of the meeting of August 23rd, 1920 were read and approved.

COMMUNICATIONS

A letter from the Pacific Gas and Electric Co. in reference to the annual tree trimming was read. Upon motion of Trustee Stephenson seconded by Trustee Hund, Chas. Lezzene was appointed Inspector for the Town to supervise the trimming and permission to trim was granted.

A letter from H. G. Ridgeway, manager of the Pacific Gas and Electric Co., stating that he would be unable to attend this meeting was read and ordered filed.

A letter from Walter H. Robinson in reference to lack of water pressure for fire protection, was read. The Clerk was instructed to communicate with Mr. Robinson for further information and to ascertain what date would be agreeable for a meeting.

A letter from the Railroad Commission in reference to conservation of Electrical Power was read and ordered filed.

A letter from H. S. Foote in reference to sending out a financial statement of the Town's affairs with the annual tax bills was read and ordered filed.

A letter from Neva Gass in reference to improvement of certain roads at the head of Canyon Road was read and referred to the Street Committee and the Town Clerk to answer.

LICENSE^o SHADBURNE PROPERTY

Mr. Geo D. Shadburne addressed the Board in reference to getting a restaurant license for a prospective tenant on his property formerly occupied by MR. Chirone. Upon motion of Trustee Thomas, seconded by Trustee Hund the matter was taken under advisement.

REPORTS

Reports from the Fire Chief and Building Inspector were received, read and ordered filed.

ORDINANCE

The ordinance introduced at the last meeting declaring certain acts to be misdemeanors, was given a second reading, and upon motion duly seconded, was adopted by the following vote:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 29

Trustee Thomas thereupon introduced a Resolution of Intention No. 29 to do the work outlined in the plans and specifications just adopted, under the Improvement Act of 1911 and amendments thereto and providing for the issuance of serial bonds to represent unpaid assessments as provided under the Improvement bond act of 1915, fixing the time for hearing protests and directing notice to be given in the manner required by law, and moved its adoption. The motion to adopt said resolution was seconded by Trustee Linnell and carried by the following vote:-

STREET OPENINGS

The representatives from the various Public Utility Companies being present in response to the invitation sent out, they were informed by the Board of the contemplated road work and improvement and requested to have all street opening work that they might have in view completed before the road work was started.

Upon motion of Trustee Hund, seconded by Trustee Thomas, the claim of C. C. Kennedy for Engineering services in the sum of \$1654.68 was ordered paid out of the 1920 Road Fund.

Upon motion duly seconded, the meeting was then adjourned to Monday, September 27th, 1920 at 8 o'clock P. M.
