

MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 26, 1923.

A Regular Adjourned meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening, February 26, 1923 at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M.

Present, Trustees Pinkham, Carl, Lutters, Deysher and Clark.
Absent, " None.

The minutes of the meeting of February 13, 1923 were read and approved.

MEDWAY ROAD SIDEWALKS

A petition from property owners on Medway Road requesting the Board to include sidewalks in the plans and specifications for the improvement of said road, was read and referred to the Engineer for checking.

Following is a copy of the petition:

"February 26th, 1923
TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO.

We the undersigned property owners of Medway Road San Anselmo do hereby petition the Honorable Board of Trustees to have sidewalks included with road work. The sidewalk to be made of concrete, four feet wide from property line.

BEE FARM COMPLAINT

A petition signed by several property owners in the vicinity of Austin and Sunnyside Avenues, requesting the Board to abate the nuisance caused by the Bees from the Apiary of Mr. S. E. Armstrong, was read by the Clerk and ordered filed.

COMMUNICATIONS

A letter from Miss Neva Gass in reference to the road conditions at the corner of Hoag Avenue and Ivy Lane was read and referred to the Street Committee.

A letter from the Marin Crushed Rock Co. offering rock for road work was read and referred to the Street Committee.

A letter from the City Planning Commission recommending the approval of the Map of Idalia Park as presented by Mr. Allen was read and ordered filed.

Letters from the Pacific Gas and Electric Co. in reference to improving the efficiency of the Street and Bridge Lighting of the Town and calling attention to the new schedule of rates were read by the Clerk. Upon motion of Trustee Pinkham seconded by Trustee Carl, it was decided that that the Street Committee should take up the offer of the Lighting Company to give the Town the services of their Mr. Ross, a Lighting Expert, and have him make a survey of the Town with an idea to increased lighting efficiency.

REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee submitted a written report which was read by the Chairman of the Board. Upon motion duly seconded, the report was laid over until the next meeting of the Board for further consideration.

SANITARY CONDITIONS IN CARRIGAN TRACT

The Chairman of the Board, Trustee Clark made a verbal report to the effect that he had in company with the Health Officer, Dr. O. W. Jones gone over the Carrigan Tract with an idea of finding out if the Sanitary Conditions existing in a portion of said Tract could not be improved. He reported that a complete solution of the problem would not be possible until the new Main Sewer was completely installed.

DEPUTY MARSHAL

Upon motion of Trustee Lutters, seconded by Trustee Pinkham, Mr. P. E. Converse was appointed a Deputy Marshal, to assist the Marshal and relieve the Fire Chief in his duties, at a salary of \$130.00 per month commencing on the 1st of March, 1923. The Clerk was directed to notify Mr. Converse of the appointment and also notify the unsuccessful applicants.

FIRE HYDRANTS

Upon motion of Trustee Deysher, seconded by Trustee Carl, the Clerk was directed to notify the Marin Municipal Water District to instal the following Fire Hydrants:-

SEQUOIA DRIVE IMPROVEMENT

Plans and specifications having been submitted by the Town Engineer for the improvement of Sequoia Drive in Sequoia Park, upon motion of Trustee Pinkham, seconded by Trustee Carl, the said plans and specifications were ordered left at the Town Hall in the custody of the Clerk or the Superintendent of Streets for public inspection until the next meeting of the Board.

BEE FARM ORDINANCE

An ordinance declaring the harboring, keeping propopagation of bees within the corporate limits of the Town of San Anselmo to be a public nuisance, was introduced by Trustee Pinkham, and given a first reading by the Clerk.

Discussion on the ordinance being invited by the Board, Messrs. Armstrong, Stafford and Barsuglia addressed the Board on the matter whereupon the ordinance was laid over until the next meeting for final action.

MAP OF IDALIA PARK

The Map of Idalia Park, being a subdivision of certain lots in the Ross Valley Park Villa Lots Tract and in the Sunnyside Tract, was submitted to the Board for approval by Mr. F. H. Allen. The Board submitted the map to the Town Engineer to check and the matter of approval was laid over until the next meeting.

AUTO PARKING ON MAGNOLIA AVENUE

A complaint in reference to the unlawful parking of automobiles on Magnolia Avenue by Messrs. Sheehan and Stafford was referred to the Police Committee.

MEDWAY ROAD IMPROVEMENT


