Reports from the Fire Chief and Bldg Inspector were received and ordered filed.

A map of a subdivision of Block "U" of Fairfax Manor having been presented for approval, the map was referred to the City Planning Commission to report back at the next meeting.

Upon motion duly seconded, demands Nos. 116 to inclusive as appear upon the demand and warrant register under this date were ordered paid.

There being no further business before the Board, an adjournment was taken until Monday evening, October 15, 1923 at 8 o'clock P.M.

MINUTES OF OCTOBER 15, 1923

A Regular Adjourned meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening October 15, 1923 at 8:00 o'clock P.M.

Full Board present; Trustee Clark in the Chair.

The minutes of the meeting of October 1, 1923 were read and approved.

This being the time fixed for the reception of bids on the Barber Tract Road Improvement Bonds issued under the proceedings commencing with Resolution of Intention No. 41 of this Board, and no bids being received, the matter was laid over to new business.

A petition for the improvement of a portion of Greenfield Avenue in San Rafael Heights, reading as follows:

"To the Honorable Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo:  
We, the undersigned property owners do hereby petition your honorable Board to have the necessary street work, gutters and curbing done on Greenfield Avenue, in the Town of San Anselmo, from the Town Limits to the intersection with the highway below Mr. Steddlemen's grounds. To be done in accordance with the Town rules and regulations.

was received and read, and upon motion duly seconded, was referred to the Town Engineer.

A Report from the City Planning commission in reference to the Map of Block "U" of Fairfax Manor, and in reference to the widening of the two Red Hill Avenue bridges, was received, read and ordered filed.

Upon motion of Trustee Deysher, seconded by Trustee Lutters, the Mayor and Clerk were authorized and directed to endorse the approval of the Board upon the Map above mentioned.

Upon motion of Trustee Lutters, seconded by Trustee Deysher, the Engineer was instructed to make a report on the matter of widening the two bridges on Red Hill Avenue and submit tentative plans.

A letter from the Pacific Gas and Electric Co. in reference to the annual tree trimming, was read and upon motion of Trustee Deysher, seconded by Trustee Lutters, the request for permission to trim trees was granted, and Mr. Chas. Lezzene was duly appointed as Inspector for the Town.

A bid was received from Mr. D. Prola for the installation of necessary sewer and Manhole at the Lansdale Bridge in the sum of \$295.00. The Engineer reported that Mr. Brownlee had submitted him a bid of \$275.00 therefore upon motion of Trustee Pinkham, seconded by Trustee Carl, the bid of S.P. Brownlee was accepted and he was duly awarded the contract for doing the work, all construction to be under the supervision of the Town Engineer.

#### BARBER TRACT ROAD BONDS

Upon motion of Trustee Pinkham, seconded by Trustee Carl, the Clerk was directed to turn over the bonds issued upon the security of the unpaid assessments, on the work done under Resolution of Intention No. 41 and subsequent proceedings, to the Contractor, Heafey, Moore and McNair, in full payment of the balance due under their contract.

A request for street lights on Greenfield Avenue by Mr. A. J. Land was referred to the Street Committee.

Mr. Wright reported that there was a leak in the Gas Main on San Anselmo Avenue somewhere between Mariposa Avenue and Bolinas Avenue. The Clerk was directed to notify the Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the condition and request them to give the matter immediate attention, notifying the Board of the action taken by them.

Demands as appear upon the demand and warrant register under this date were ordered paid.

There being no further business before the Board, upon motion duly seconded the meeting was adjourned to Monday evening, November 5, 1923 at 8 o'clock P.M.
