

MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 30, 1925.

Pursuant to adjournment a meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo was held in the Town Hall on Monday, November 30, 1925, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present, Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Absent, None.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

PETITIONS:

A petition signed by numerous property owners on Melville Ave. requesting that said street be not included in the plan of improvement, plans and specifications for which were ordered by the Board November 2, 1925, was read. Upon motion of Trustee Pinkham, the petition was referred to the Town Engineer for checking with instructions to proceed no further with the work until his report at next meeting. Motion was seconded by Trustee Deysher, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None.

A petition signed by a number of tax payers requesting the Trustees to renonsider the matter of the closing of the first railroad crossing East of Main Street was read. Chairman Clark informed them that in as much as the matter was now before the Railroad Commission for consideration, said petition should be presented directly to the Commission. Upon motion of Trustee Pinkham, the Clerk was instructed to forward said petition to the Railroad Commission. Motion was seconded by Trustee Carl, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None.

A petition signed by numerous tax payers requesting that the Board take steps toward replacing the bridge across San Anselmo Creek at the foot of Tamalpais Ave. was read. Chairman Clark explained that the matter rested entirely with the Railroad Commission and that action on the same is now pending.

MORNINGSIDE COURT WATER MAINS:

Several property owners of Morningside Court were present in response to notices mailed out by the Clerk for the

purpose of discussing the water main situation in said tract. After considerable discussion, Chairman Clark informed those present that the Board of Trustees was willing to act in any^{way}/agreeable to the majority and fully explained the attitude of the Water District Board. Upon motion of Trustee Peyton, the matter was laid over until such time as Mr. Doherty could offer something tangible to present to the Water Board in the way of an agreement.

REDWOOD ROAD:

Upon motion of Trustee Peyton, December 14, 1925 was fixed as the time for hearing of protests on the Redwood Avenue job. Motion was seconded by Trustee Pinkham, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Trustee Pinkham, the Clerk was authorized to make certain corrections on the assessment roll. Motion was seconded by Trustee Carl and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None.

COMMUNICATIONS:

A letter signed by C.A. Nealon petitioning the Board to repair a culvert in front of his property on Alameda Road, Short-Ranch, was read, and the Clerk instructed to advise the writer that he should address his communication to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marin, as this matter comes under its jurisdiction.

A letter signed by Mrs. Gandolfo calling the Board's attention to the condition of the street on which her home fronts, was read and referred to the Street Committee.

Upon motion of Trustee Deysher, the application of Lavaroni Bros. to install a gasoline filling station in front of their store at Yolanda, was granted. Motion was seconded by Trustee Pinkham, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: Trustee Peyton.

Upon Motion of Trustee Peyton warrant numbers 640 to 654 inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Trustee Carl, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned to Monday, December 14, 1925 at 8 o'clock P.M.
