

MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 1, 1926.

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo was held at the Town Hall on Monday evening, February 1, 1926. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Present: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Absent: None.

OLIVE AVE. NO. 70:

This being the time to which was continued the hearing of protests on the work done on Olive Ave., and the Clerk having read one protest which was referred to the Engineer for checking, and the Engineer reporting that signatures affixed thereon totaled less than fifty percent of the property owners along said Avenue, Trustee Peyton thereupon introduced a Resolution overruling protests and moved its adoption. Motion was seconded by Trustee Carl and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl and Deysher.
Noes: Trustee Clark. Trustee Pinkham declined to vote, not being sufficiently posted in the matter.

Thereupon Trustee Peyton introduced a Resolution Ordering the Work and directed the Clerk to advertise for bids and moved its adoption. Motion to adopt said resolution was seconded by Trustee Carl and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl and Deysher.
Noes: Trustee Clark. Trustee Pinkham declined to vote, not being sufficiently posted in the matter.

Trustee Peyton then introduced a Resolution Ordering the work to be done under the direction of the Town Engineer instead of the Superintendent of Streets and moved its adoption. Motion was seconded by Trustee Carl and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl and Deysher.
Noes: Trustee Clark. Trustee Pinkham declined to vote, not being sufficiently posted in the matter.

Trustee Peyton thereupon introduced a Resolution Directing that Assessment be made and signed by the Town Engineer instead of the Superintendent of Streets, and moved its adoption. Motion to adopt said resolution was seconded by Trustee Carl and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl and Deysher.
Noes: Trustee Clark. Trustee Pinkham declined to vote, not being sufficiently posted in the matter.

Upon motion of Trustee Pinkham, the Town Engineer and the Town Attorney were instructed to ascertain from the State Highway Commission just where its jurisdiction begins on Red Hill Ave., east of

Main St. and to report back at next meeting. Motion was seconded by

Trustee Carl and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None
Absent: None.

Dr. DeLancy, having examined Mr. Silvio Ardito, who made application for a free peddler's license, reported his inability to find any physical disability and upon motion of Trustee Peyton, application was denied. Motion was seconded by Trustee Deysher, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None.

LANSDALE AVE. JOB.:

Upon motion of Trustee Peyton, the matter of the improvement of Lansdale Ave. was extended to the next meeting of the Board.

Motion was seconded by Trustee Pinkham, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Trustee Peyton, the Town Attorney was instructed to apply to the Railroad Commission for a ré-hearing in the matter of closing the bridge at foot of Tamalpais Ave. Motion was seconded by Trustee Pinkham, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None.

PETITIONS:

A petition bearing fifteen signatures for the improvement of Florence Ave., and certified by the Engineer that it represented over fifty percent of the property owners along said Avenue was read.

FLORENCE AVE.:

Thereupon Trustee Peyton introduced a Resolution Ordering Plans and Specifications for the following work to be done and improved to be made/ and moved its adoption:- grading and paving Florence Ave. for its entire length, construction of concrete curbs and gutters, connecting side sewers with main trunk line sewer, and installing proper drainage. Motion was seconded by Trustee Pinkham, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.
Noes: None.

A petition signed by five property owners along Elm Ave. requesting the Board to take the necessary action with a view to having sidewalks constructed for the entire length of Elm Ave. was read and referred to the Street Committee.

SIDEWALKS - SAN ANSELMO, ELM AND SCENIC AVES.

Upon motion of Trustee Peyton, the Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the building of sidewalks along San Anselmo Ave. from Yolanda to Lansdale Station, along Elm Ave. for its entire length, and along Scenic Ave. from San Anselmo Ave. to the end of the paved area. Motion was seconded by Trustee Carl and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and ~~Clerk~~.

Noes: ~~None~~. *None. Note Clark*

REPORTS:

Reports of the Building Inspector and Fire Chief for the month of January were read and ordered filed.

Trustee Deysher was unable to report in the matter of the application of Charles Johnson to install a gasoline pump and underground storage tank in front of his premises on Red Hill Ave. until such time as the State Highway Commission advises him of its jurisdiction.

COMMUNICATIONS:

A letter from Mr. Ridgeway, of the Pacific Gas & Electric Co. relative to the installation of highway lighting units along Red Hill Ave. was read, and upon motion of Trustee Peyton the Clerk was directed to reply to the effect that the Board did not wish to consider the proposition at this time.

A letter from the Union Oil Co. relative to displaying safety posters on bill-boards was referred to the City Planning Commission.

Upon motion of Trustee Peyton, warrants Nos. 752 to 755, Inc. were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Trustee Pinkham, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Peyton, Carl, Pinkham, Deysher and Clark.

Noes: None.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned to Monday evening, February 8, 1926, at the hour of 8 o'clock.
