MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 6TH, 1927.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held in the Council Chambers on Tuesday, September 6th, 1927 at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Schmidt, Carl, Smith, Hensley & Peyton.
 Absent: None.
 Councilman Peyton presiding as Mayor.

The minutes of August 9th, 1927; also of the Special Meeting of August 25th, 1927, were read and approved.

PETITIONS:

A petition bearing the signatures of members of the San Anselmo Rotary Club, urging the Council to take action before the Railroad Commission to the end that the North Western Pacific Railroad Company be required to properly safe guard the Tunstead, Ross and Bolinas Aves. crossings, by means of safety gates or flagmen, was read; also a communication from the Railroad Commission calling the Council's attention to the fact that the Bolinas Ave. crossing is not properly protected by an advance warning sign, as provided under Section No. 117 of the California Vehicle Act, was read and upon motion of Councilman Hensley, the Clerk was instructed to refer the ^{entire} matter to the Railroad Commission and to advise them that the Council will conform to every regulation required of them in connection with the necessary procedure. Motion was seconded by Councilman Smith and carried by the following vote:

A letter from Peat, Marwick, Mitchell & Co. certified public accountants, relative to the annual award of contract for auditing the town books and accounts, was read and the Clerk instructed to advise them that the matter had not yet been definitely considered but that they would be advised later on.

A communication from the League of California Municipalities advising Council of its 29th Annual Convention, to be held in Sacramento on September 19th, to 22nd, was read, and placed on file. Councilman Hensley stated that he probably would attend.
