An adjourned meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held in the Council Chambers on Monday evening, October 10th, 1927.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

RESOLUTION CONFIRMING PROCEEDINGS & ORDERING WARRANT NO. 81:

This being the time set for the hearing of protests against assessments and described in Resolution of Intention No. 81 of this Council, and no written protests having been filed with the Clerk, Councilman Smith introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

"It is hereby resolved and determined by the Council of the Town of San Anselmo that the proceedings pursuant to Resolution of Intention No. 81, passed by said Council on the 15th day of November, 1926, and also all of the acts and determinations of the Superintendent of Streets of said Town, relative to the work and described in Resolution of Intention referred to for further particulars, be and the same are hereby confirmed and the assessment and diagram for said work are hereby found to be correct and confirmed, and it is hereby ordered that warrant may be attached thereto accordingly".

He stated that a concrete stairway could be constructed at a cost of approximately \$800. and that he would advise the Scenic Canyon Improvement Co. petitioners with the view towards forming a district to defray the expense.
