MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 7, 1927.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held in the Council Chambers on Monday Evening, November 7th, 1927.

ISSUANCE OF BONDS - RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO.80 (Canyon Road):

This being the time and place set for the hearing of protests against assessment described in Resolution of Intention No.80, and no protests having been filed with the Clerk, Councilman Smith introduced an Order for the Issuance of Bonds to represent the unpaid assessments on the work and improvement of Canyon Road, under Resolution of Intention No.

80 of this Council, fixing the amount of bonds, number, serials and interest coupons, etc. and moved its adoption. Resolution was seconded by Councilman Hensley and carried by the following vote:

The petition of Helen Wolf asking Council to cancel an assessment of \$1400 valuation for improvements on the grounds that her home was not completed at the time assessment was levied on the first Monday in March, 1927, was read and referred to the Attorney for his opinion.

COMMUNICATIONS:

A communication, signed Anna G. Loser, calling Council's attention to a nuisance resulting from water collecting and standing at the corner of Grove Lane and San Rafael Ave. was read and referred to the Street Committee for investigation.

A letter signed A.H. Siemer thanking Council for its promptness in remedying a faulty sewer in the Carrigan Tract was read and placed on file.
