

MINUTES OF MEETING MARCH 12, 1928.

An adjourned meeting of the Council was held on Monday, March 12th, 1928, at 8 o'clock P.M.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

CITY HALL AVE. AND LIBRARY PLACE (Res. of Int.#87:)

This being the time to which was continued the hearing of protests on the work to be done on City Hall Avenue and Library Place, under Resolution of Intention No. 87 of this council, and no written protests having been filed with the Clerk, Councilman Smith introduced a Resolution ordering the work and directing the Clerk to advertise for bids, and moved its adoption. Resolution was seconded by Councilman Hensley and carried by the following vote:
