

MINUTES OF MAY 7, 1928.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday evening, May 7th, 1928.

Present: Councilmen Siemer, Fusselman, Smith, Hensley & Schmidt.
Absent: None.

Councilman Schmidt in the Chair.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

PETITIONS:

A petition bearing signatures of many property owners in the Short Ranch and asking for the installation of a Fire Alarm Box at Santa Cruz Ave. and San Francisco Boulevard was read.

Upon motion of Councilman Hensley, the matter was referred to the Fire Committee for consideration. Motion was seconded by Councilmen Fusselman and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Siemer, Fusselman, Smith, Hensley & Schmidt.
Noes: None.

A communication from the Yolansdale Church, signed by Dr. Day, and asking the Council to take necessary steps towards clearing title to a four foot strip paralleling Redwood Road was read. Upon motion of Councilman Hensley, the matter was referred to the Attorney with instructions to report back at next meeting of the Council. Motion was seconded by Councilman Smith and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilman Siemer, Fuseelman, Smith, Hensley & Schmidt.
Noes: None.

A request for a five months' leave of absence beginning on or about May 24th, 1928, was made by Councilman Hensley. Upon motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Fusselman, permission was granted by unanimous vote.

A communication signed by John Heilman, owner of a lot in Iansdale, asking Council to change present entrance to his lot was read and referred to the Engineer for investigation.

The reports of the Fire Chief and Building Inspector for the month of April, were read and placed on file.

A communication from Austin & Company, Certified Public Accountants of San Francisco, in reference to the auditing of the Town's books was read and referred to the Finance Committee for consideration.

Councilman Hensley called attention to the urgent need for

arterial stop signs at various intersections in the Town. After some discussion it was agreed that the Police and Street Committees should look into the matter and make a survey of the situation and necessary recommendations towards having same installed.

The Clerk was directed to write the Highway Commission for permission of Town to install a catch basin on the north side of Red Hill Ave. between Forbes Avenue and Sequoia Drive.

WARRANTS:

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman, Warrants Nos. 441 to 474, inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

MINUTES OF JUNE 4TH, 1928.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, June 4th, 1928, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A communication signed by Mr. and Mrs. Frank Walter, requesting Council to repair a section of Madera Ave. in Sequoia Park was read and referred to the Street Committee.

A communication signed by K. Robson calling attention to the matter of topping trees to avoid interference with the public service wires was read and referred to the Park and Building Committees.

REZONING (ORDINANCE #190):

A petition signed by the Highland Realty Company, owners of the land in question, and numerous property owners adjacent thereto, requesting Council to re-zone a parcel of land lying between the Right of Way of the Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, Red Hill Ave., the
