MINUTES OF JUNE 4TH, 1928.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, June 4th, 1928, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Siemer, Fusselman, Smith & Schmidt.  
Absent: Councilman Hensley.

Councilman Schmidt presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A communication signed by Mr. and Mrs. Frank Walter, requesting Council to repair a section of Madera Ave. in Sequoia Park was read and referred to the Street Committee.

A communication signed by K. Robson calling attention to the matter of topping trees to avoid interference with the public service wires was read and referred to the Park and Building Committees.

REZONING (ORDINANCE #190):

A petition signed by the Highland Realty Company, owners of the land in question, and numerous property owners adjacent thereto, requesting Council to re-zone a parcel of land lying between the Right of Way of the Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, Red Hill Ave., the

Easterly boundary line of the corporate limits of San Anselmo, and Greenfield Ave. and to classify same "Commercial Zone", was read and action was deferred until next meeting of the Council, at which time a newly appointed City Planning Commission will take the matter under advisement.

A communication signed by Wade F. Thomas, as member of the Executive Committee of the May Day Celebration, thanking Council for its co-operation in lending the use of men and tractor for work on the Athletic field, was read and placed on file.

A communication from the Library Board ascertaining Council's attitude with regard to the removal of the two palm trees in front of the Library Building was read and placed on file. The Clerk was instructed to inform the Library Board that the Council had no objection to the removal of said trees.

The matter of the installation of a fire alarm box which was petitioned for by residents of the Short Ranch was deferred until next meeting of the Board to allow for further consideration on the part of the Fire Committee.

AUDIT OF TOWN ACCOUNTS:

The Chairman of the Finance Committee, having reported that a firm of Certified Public Accountants, agreed to an annual audit of town accounts at a figure of \$160.; also that further service in connection therewith would be rendered for an additional sum of \$25. per month, upon motion of Councilman Siemer, the Chairman of the Finance Committee was given full power to employ Messrs. Victor, Aaron, Jones and Sutter, Certified Public Accounts of San Francisco to audit the accounts of the Town, and also to perform the additional service mentioned above in connection with said audit for a period of one month. Motion was seconded by Councilman Smith and carried by the following vote:

ELM AVE. SEWERS:

After some discussion, the matter of the installation of sewers offering relief to residents on Elm and Madrone Avenues, was referred to the Sanitary Committee for consideration.

The Town Attorney reported on the matter of a 4 foot strip along Redwood Road, which was referred to him at the meeting of May 7th, stating that he was unable to obtain a deed to said property since the Owner's estate has never been probated, she having disposed of her property before death.

BOULEVARD ORDINANCE:

"An Ordinance designating certain public streets and highways in the Town, as Boulevards, regulating traffic thereon, and upon streets intersecting such boulevards, and providing for signs and sign posts upon such Boulevards and intersection streets" was presented for first reading and was read.

WARRANTS:

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman Warrants Nos. 475 to 512, inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

STREET LIGHTING:

A representative of the Pacific Gas & Electric Co. addressed the Council in connection with "improved lighting" in the business district. After some discussion upon motion of Councilman Siemer, the Pacific Gas & Electric Co. was authorized to install, free of charge, and without any obligation on the part of the Town, a group of 4 Sample Washington Top Lights for a period of two months. Motion was seconded by Councilman Fusselman and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman, Wade F. Thomas was appointed to serve on the Library Board and the Clerk was directed to notify him of such fact and to extend a vote of thanks to him for his interest in Library affairs. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

CITY PLANNING COMMISSION:

Upon motion of Councilman Siemer, the Clerk was directed to communicate with the local Real Estate Board, Rotary Club, Women's Improvement Club and the San Anselmo Post of the American Legion, with the view to having each organization propose a member to serve on the City Planning Commission, which will be appointed by the Council at its next regular meeting. Motion was seconded by Councilman Fusselman and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman a \$25. donation was made to the Indian Marathon Race Committee. Motion was seconded by Councilman Smith and carried by the following vote:

Noes: Councilman Siemer.  
Absent: Councilman Hensley.

The vacation schedules for Town employees was read and placed on file.

Upon motion of Councilman Siemer, the Street Committee was given full power to employ an extra man in the Street Department for the summer months at a salary not in excess of \$100. Motion was seconded by Councilman Fusselman and carried by the following vote:

Noes: None.  
Absent: Councilman Hensley.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Monday, July 2nd, 1928, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.
