MINUTES OF JANUARY 7, 1929.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, January 7th, 1929, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Siemer, Fusselman, Smith, Hensley and Schmidt.

Councilman Schmidt presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

PETITIONS:

A petition bearing signatures of the majority of property

owners asking for permanent improvements along San Anselmo Avenue was read and upon motion of Councilman Siemer the Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the following work to be done and improvement to be made in said Town, to-wit:

That San Anselmo Avenue, from the Northerly line of Ross Avenue, to the Southerly line of Tamalpais Avenue, be improved by widening the street area and reconstructing curbs and gutters, and curb radius curves, so as to provide greater width of street and facilitate better traffic conditions in said business district; also that a suitable system of ornamental street lighting be installed in said district; Further, that the existing light and telephone poles be removed from said district.

Motion was seconded by Councilman Smith and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion of Councilman Siemer, Ashley and Bottini were granted an extension of time (February 15, 1929) in which to complete their contract on Oak Avenue, pursuant to Resolution of Intention No. 88.

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman the matter was referred to the Engineer to determine whether a majority of property owners were for or against such improvement. Motion was seconded by Councilman Smith and carried by the following vote:

Dowling, owner of Lot 75 San Rafael Heights Tract, petitioning Council to consider excluding said lot from the fire limit zone, also to advise her whether or not there is a sewer in Greenfield Avenue, was read and referred to the Building Committee. The Clerk was instructed to refer the matter pertaining to the sewer to the Sanitary Board and to advise the writer of such action.

The communication from the League of California Municipalities enclosing The California Plumbing Code, was referred to the Building Committee.
