

MINUTES OF MAY 6, 1929.

A regular meeting of the Council of San Anselmo was held on Monday, May 6th, 1929, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilman Siemer, Fusselman, Smith, Hensley and Schmidt.

Absent: None.

Councilman Schmidt presiding.

The Minutes of the previous two meetings were read and approved.

PETITIONS:

A communication bearing the signature of E.B. du Bois, owner of a tract of land lying northwesterly of Sequoia Park requesting information as to whether or not Council has any objection to his connecting proposed roads and lanes within his tract with the roads, lanes, drives and avenues in Sequoia Park, was read, and the Clerk instructed to inform Mr. Du Bois in writing that Council has no objection.

A communication from J.L. Fuller, a property owner in the Barber Tract, calling Council's attention to the necessity of a sidewalk across the railroad tracks from Main Street to Ross Avenue was read and referred to the Street Committee for consideration.

A communication from the Parent Teacher's Association petitioning Council to install an arterial stop sign at the intersection of Ross Avenue and Kensington Road was read and the Clerk was instructed to inform the writer that no arterial stop can be installed since that particular intersection is not included in the Ordinance designating Boulevard Stops in the Town. The Superintendent of Streets was instructed to repaint existing signs marked "Slow" in the district above mentioned.

A communication from the Anglo California Trust Company relative to the Morningside Court property owners' gas refund was read and the Clerk instructed to inform the writer that distribution of such funds will be made in the very near future.

A communication from the Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company acknowledging receipt of a Resolution granting permission to construct and maintain an additional track across Main Street was read

and placed on file.

Similar action was taken on the communication from the Division of Highways regarding improvement of that portion of the State Highway within the corporate limits of the Town.

REPORTS:

Upon motion of Councilman Smith, the diagram of the Telephone Company showing underground lateral along Main and Pine Sts. also pole locations and anchors in connection with the proposed widening of San Anselmo Avenue was approved and accepted and the Clerk instructed to notify the Company of such action. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

The reports of the Building Inspector and Fire Chief for the month of April were read and placed on file.

WARRANTS:

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman, Warrants Nos. 419 to 433 inclusive, also Warrants Nos. 437 to 458, inclusive were ordered paid and Warrants Nos. 434 to 436 inclusive were cancelled and destroyed. Motion was seconded by Councilman Smith and carried by the following vote:

CANVAS OF ELECTION RETURNS - HAWTHORNE HILLS ANNEXATION:

This being the time set for canvassing the returns of the Special Election (Hawthorne Hills Annexation) held on April 24, 1929, Council canvassed such returns and found the following votes cast:

Mr. Torrano appeared before the Council and extended an invitation to all members thereof to participate in an American Legion patriotic demonstration to be held on May 30th, 1929, at the hour of 10 o'clock A.M. in San Rafael.

PROCLAMATION:

The Mayor issued a Proclamation to the inhabitants of the Town of San Anselmo that during the period between the 26th day of May and the 1st day of June, 1929, there will be launched among all citizens a movement towards clearing property of all weeds, dirt and rubbish.

Permission was granted Mr. A.B. Cauldwell to erect a garage on his property on San Anselmo Avenue, conforming to the design suggested by the Building Committee.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned to Monday, May 13, 1929 at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

MINUTES OF MAY 13TH, 1929.

A meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, May 13th, 1929, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Siemer, Fusselman, Smith, Hensley and Schmidt.

Absent: None.

Councilman Schmidt presiding.

Councilman Hensley was appointed Clerk Pro Tem.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting were dispensed with.

PETITIONS:

The petition of E.B. DuBois, praying Council to adopt a Resolution accepting offer of dedication of streets, roads, avenues, drives, etc., in Sequoia Park, Sections 1 and 2, as described in a certain deed from The Doherty Co. to the Town of San Anselmo, dated Feb. 1st, 1921, was read and action thereon was deferred until next meeting of the Council.

Petition of Jos. P. Baloun and others praying Council to quiet title to strip of land along Redwood Road was read and referred to the Attorney. Mr. Baloun and Dr. Day addressed Council and urged that action be taken in the matter.

DEEDS:

Upon motion of Councilman Smith, the deeds from The Doherty Company to the Town of San Anselmo, conveying 1 ft. strip, marked and designated on Maps of Sequoia Park, Sections 1 and 2; also Lot H, shown and designated on Map No. 2, Morningside Court, were accepted and the Clerk instructed to file same for record with the County Recorder.

Motion was seconded by Councilman Smith and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Siemer, Fusselman, Smith, Hensley and Schmidt.
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Smith, the deed dated May 13, 1929 from S.P. Blumberg to the Town of San Anselmo was accepted and the Clerk instructed to file same for record with the County Recorder. Motion
