MINUTES OF MAY 13TH, 1929.

A meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, May 13th, 1929, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Siemer, Fusselman, Smith, Hensley and Schmidt.

Absent: None.

Councilman Schmidt presiding.

Councilman Hensley was appointed Clerk Pro Tem.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting were dispensed with.

PETITIONS:

The petition of E.B. DuBois, praying Council to adopt a Resolution accepting offer of dedication of streets, roads, avenues, drives, etc., in Sequoia Park, Sections 1 and 2, as described in a certain deed from The Doherty Co. to the Town of San Anselmo, dated Feb. 1st, 1921, was read and action thereon was deferred until next meeting of the Council.

Petition of Jos. P. Baloun and others praying Council to quiet title to strip of land along Redwood Road was read and referred to the Attorney. Mr. Baloun and Dr. Day addressed Council and urged that action be taken in the matter.

DEEDS:

Upon motion of Councilman Smith, the deeds from The Doherty Company to the Town of San Anselmo, conveying 1 ft. strip, marked and designated on Maps of Sequoia Park, Sections 1 and 2; also Lot H, shown and designated on Map No. 2, Morningside Court, were accepted and the Clerk instructed to file same for record with the County Recorder.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 89 - ELM COURT:

This being the time set for the hearing of protests on the work to be done in Elm Court under Resolution of Intention No. 89 of this Council, and no written protests having been filed with the Clerk, Councilman Smith introduced a Resolution ordering the work and directing the Clerk to advertise for bids and moved its adoption. RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 92 - MORNINGSIDE COURT NO. 2:

This being the time set for the hearing of protests on the work to be done in Morningside Court No. 2 under Resolution of Intention No. 92 of this Council, and one written protest having been filed with the Clerk and read, Councilman Smith introduced a Resolution over-ruling said protest and ordering the work and directing the Clerk to advertise for bids, and moved its adoption. Resolution was seconded by Councilman Hensley and carried by the following vote:

The following Resolution from the American Legion in connection with such appointment was received a read:

"RESOLVED by San Anselmo Post No. 179 The American Legion in regular meeting assembled this thirteenth day of May, 1929 that we respectfully urge the Town Trustees of San Anselmo in making appointment of the new traffic officer for San Anselmo to give due consideration to residents of San Anselmo and Marin County who are ex-service men."

Upon motion of Councilman Hensley, John G. Reynolds was appointed Traffic Officer vice Milton D. Story, at a salary of \$150. per month, such appointment to date from and including May 14th, 1929. Motion was seconded by Councilman Fusselman.

The following Resolution was unanimously adopted: "In the matter of new crossing from San Anselmo Ave. to Sycamore Ave. resolved that entire cost of paving that portion of said crossing which lies between lines 2' outside of the outside rails of its tracks, shall be borne by the Town of San Anselmo."
