

MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 3, 1929.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, September 3rd, 1929, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Siemer, Fusselman, Hensley and Schmidt.
Absent: Councilman Smith.

Councilman Schmidt presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Chair appointed Councilman Hensley a member of the Finance Committee pro tem.

PETITIONS:

A petition bearing the signatures of several hundred tax payers and residents of the Town and requesting Council to provide tennis courts in the new play ground was read and referred to the Park Committee for recommendation.

Application was made by The Wells Fargo Bank and Union Trust Co. on behalf of their client, Emily duBois, for a reduction in taxes. The matter was referred to the Assessor for investigation.

The petition of Fred W. Carpenter and others for the installation of street lights at the intersections of Madrone and Bella Vista Avenues, and Red Hill Ave. was read and referred to the Lighting Committee.

Upon recommendation of the Police Committee, Officer Nello Marcucci was appointed Acting Chief of Police during the absence of the Chief.

APPOINTMENT OF CHAS. R. ORCHARD TO TRAFFIC DEPT.

Upon motion of Councilman Hensley, Charles R. Orchard was appointed Traffic Officer at the Red Hill Ave. School at a salary of \$20. per month, such appointment to date from August 12th, 1929. Motion was seconded by Councilman Fusselman and carried by the following vote:

COMMUNICATIONS:

A communication from the State Board of Health inviting members of the City Council or representatives to attend the annual meeting of the California Sewage Works Assn. to be held at Hotel Oakland on

October 7, to 9th, was read and placed on file.

A communication was received from the Kentfield Chamber of Commerce, relative to forming a district with the view of clearing the San Anselmo Creek of all underbrush and debris was read and the Chairman announced that he would appoint a Committee of three to confer with County officials, under whose direction such a district would be created.

A communication signed Alice L. Croker, calling Council's attention to improper drainage fronting her property on San Anselmo Ave. was read and the Engineer reported that the matter had already been taken care of.

A report from the Board of Fire Underwriters in connection with decreased insurance rates, provided the Bond Issue carries, and certain recommendations as set forth in their report are carried out, was read and placed on file.

ORDINANCE NO. 200.

Upon motion of Councilman Hensley, seconded by Councilman Siemer, "An Ordinance creating and establishing Fire Zones in the Town of San Anselmo" was given its final reading by the Clerk and was then passed and adopted by the following vote:

The Ordinance was then signed by Mayor Schmidt and numbered 200.

ORDINANCE NO. 201 - CALLING BOND ELECTION:

Upon motion of Councilman Hensley, seconded by Councilman Siemer, "An Ordinance calling an Election to be held in the Town of San Anselmo, Marin County, State of California, to submit to the qualified voters thereof the proposition of incurring a bonded debt by said Town for the purpose of paying the cost of certain municipal improvements therein", was presented for first reading and was read.

Upon motion of Councilman Siemer, the Clerk was instructed to change the minutes of February 4th, 1929, in relation to Ordinances Nos. 198 and 199, so that the minutes of said date will show correctly the final passage on said date of Ordinance No. 198, relating to the Building Ordinance and the introduction and first reading of Ordinance No. 199, relating to Zoning Ordinance. Motion was seconded by Councilman Hensley and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman, Warrants Nos. 40 to 87, inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman, R.M. Overdick was appointed Auditor for the Town, for a period of one year from date. Duties to be the same as those in effect at the end of year just passed with the addition of establishing a Bond and Interest ledger. Salary to be \$50. per month. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

The reports of the Building Inspector and the Fire Chief for the month of August were received and placed on file.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, September 10th, 1929, at 8 o'clock.
