RESOLUTION ORDERING WORK (RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 94)

This being the time set for the hearing of protests on the work to be done under Resolution of Intention No. 94, in the matter of "Acquisition and Improvement District No. 2 of the Town of San Anselmo, and no written protests having been filed with the Clerk, Councilman Smith introduced a Resolution ordering the work and directing the Clerk to advertise for bids and moved its adoption. Motion was seconded by Councilman Hensley and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion of Councilman Hensley, seconded by Councilman Smith, the Clerk was directed to notify banks and bonding houses that the Council will receive and open bids in connection with the sale of the \$30,000. Fire Protection Bonds, on Monday, November 4th, 1929.

Councilman Smith reported the completion of a storm sewer along Butterfield Road.
