Upon motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Hensley, an Ordinance providing for the incurring of a bonded indebtedness for the Town of San Anselmo in the sum of \$30,000 to pay the costs of certain municipal improvements and providing for the issuance of bonds evidencing such indebtedness was presented for final reading by the Clerk ^{was read} and was thereafter passed and adopted by the following vote:

PETITIONS:

A petition of Mr. W. M. Rutherford seeking permission to remove certain trees along his sidewalk area was read. Upon motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Hensley, permission was granted.

A Resolution adopted by the Sequoia Improvement Club at a meeting held on October 18th, recommending the installation of a proposed sewer in Sequoia Park was read and after some discussion, the matter was referred to the Street Committee with instructions to report back at next regular meeting.

Upon motion of Councilman Hensley, seconded by Councilman Smith, the Clerk was directed to notify banks and bonding houses that the Council will receive and open bids in connection with the sale of the \$30,000. Fire Protection Bonds, on Monday, November 4th, 1929.

Councilman Smith reported the completion of a storm sewer along Butterfield Road.

A communication signed Wm. A. Neff, Supt. Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, with reference to the wig wag signal at the Sequoia Park crossing on Greenfield Ave. was read and referred to the Street Committee for consideration.

A letter from the Mother's Club of St. Anselm's Parochial School in reference to the Town bearing half the expense of installing School Zone Signs was read and the Clerk instructed to inform the writer that the San Anselmo School Board stood the entire expense of such service in the vicinity of the Red Hill Avenue Grammar School and that the Town would pay no part of the expense of such installation.

Upon motion of Councilman Hensley, seconded by Councilman Fusselman, the Engineer was instructed to prepare a map showing such property as was included in the recent Hawthorn Hills Annexation to the Town of San Anselmo.
