MINUTES OF JULY 22, 1930.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, July 22, 1930, at the hour of 8:30 P.M.

Present; Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Absent: None.

Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read. Councilman McKannay moved that the minutes of that meeting be changed to show that Warrant #592 was not approved for payment because it was in direct violation of Article VI, Section 886, California Laws for Municipal Corporations of the Sixth Class, entitled "No Officer to be interested in any public contract". Councilman Siemer seconded the motion and it was adopted by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer and Fusselman.

Noes: None.

Councilmen Jordan and Wright declined to vote.

PETITIONS:

Petitions were received from Walter C. Weener and others for the installation of a fire hydrant at the corner of Alameda and Jersey Road. These were referred to Councilman Wright, Chairman of the Fire Committee.

BIDS:

A sealed bid was received and opened, which was submitted by R. A. Carey, and was an offer of \$700.00 for a parcel of ground owned by the Town, located on Saunders Ave. and Taylor St. The bid was accompanied by a deposit of \$10. It was decided to hold this matter open until other parties who might be interested in the property might have a chance to submit a bid also, and the next regular meeting was decided as the time to further consider the matter.

COMMUNICATIONS:

A letter was read from the Seagrave Corporation, acknowledging receipt of a Town warrant in the amount of \$8500. and requesting that the balance due of \$500.00 be forwarded immediately. The Clerk was instructed to inform them that as soon as replacement on one defective piece

of equipment had been received and found to be satisfactory, the balance would be forwarded.

A letter signed by E. A. Brooks, suggesting changes in the new Traffic Ordinance No. 207 recently enacted, was read and referred to Councilman Wright, Chairman of the Police Committee.

A letter signed Henriette Jones and Farrington L. Jones requesting additional time in which to submit a bid on the Town property located on Saunders Ave. was read and the Clerk was instructed to inform them that the matter would be held open until the next regular meeting, and if interested that they should submit a bid accompanied by a deposit.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL:

Councilman Fusselman submitted a resolution directing that the Clerk publish a notice inviting sealed proposals for the exclusive right of collecting garbage in the Town of San Anselmo. The resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote.

DODGER ORDINANCE #208:

Councilman McKannay made a motion to repeal all existing dodger ordinances in force at the present time and to nullify all dodger ordinances in process of legislation. Councilman Siemer seconded the motion and it carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Councilman McKannay then submitted a new dodger ordinance for the first reading, which was read by the Clerk.

TENNIS COURTS AND PLAY GROUND EQUIPMENT:

Considerable discussion was had in connection with the building of the proposed tennis courts, both as to the advisability of incurring additional indebtedness and whether two courts should be built instead of four. Messrs. Carey, Hoskinson and Greenberg were present and addressed the Council relative to the matter. Upon motion of Councilman Siemer plans and specification for the construction of four tennis courts at a total cost of \$8,000. were ordered prepared. Motion was seconded by Councilman McKannay and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilman McKannay, Siemer and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilman Jordan,
Councilman Wright declined to vote.

Councilman Jordan explained that his reason for voting "No" was because he felt that the total indebtedness of the Town, both on Municipal Improvement Bonds and Special Assessment Bonds, was sufficiently high and he

could not see his way clear to increase the burden.

RESOLUTION ORDERING PLANS (TENNIS COURTS NO.)

Councilman Siemer introduced a resolution directing the Engineer to prepare plans and specifications for the construction of four asphalt tennis courts in the public park, with fence surrounding same. Resolution was seconded by Councilman McKannay and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilman Jordan.
Councilman Wright declined to vote.

WARRANTS:

Upon motion of Councilman McKannay Warrants Nos. 653 to 666 inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Councilman McKannay then moved that Warrants Nos. 616 and 617 in the amounts of \$31.10 and \$1.50, respectively, both payable to F. Milani, be rescinded on the grounds of illegal expenditures and also in violation of Article VI, Section 886. These warrants had been previously approved for payment at the meeting of the Council on July 7, 1930. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilman McKannay, Siemer and Fusselman.
Councilmen Jordan and Wright declined to vote.

SAN ANSELMO AVE. PARKING: (Diagonal vs. Parallel Parking)

After some discussion on the matter of parking in the business district, Councilman McKannay moved that a trial be made of diagonal parking on the east side of San Anselmo Ave. from Ross to Tamalpais Ave. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilman Jordan.
Councilman Wright declined to vote.

Upon motion of Councilman McKannay, seconded by Councilman Jordan, the Chief of Police was instructed to swear out a complaint against Mr. Schuler for building a fence in violation of the building laws of the town. This motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Monday, August 4th, 1930, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.
