MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 2, 1930.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, August 2nd, 1930, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

PRESENT: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
 ABSENT: None. Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

PETITIONS:

The petition of C. F. Schwerin and others for permanent improvement of Karlshrue Park streets was read and placed on file. The Clerk reported a majority of property owners in favor of such improvement. There-

after Councilman Siemer introduced a resolution directing the Engineer to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of Karl Avenue, Rose Lane and Berlin Ave. with hydraulic concrete pavement, including curbs and gutters and necessary drainage system. Resolution was seconded by Councilman Jordan and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

The petition of N. E. Marcucci for a relief man in the Fire Department was read and placed on file and the matter was referred to the Fire Committee for recommendation.

The petition of A. A. De Costa for the installation of a street light in his neighborhood was read and the matter was referred to the Street Committee.

The petition of Richard Best and other property owners in the district, asking Council to prohibit parking on both sides of Redwood Ave. was read and the matter was referred to the Police Department for investigation.

The petition of Dr. Derby, with sketch attached, requesting Council to take the necessary steps to legally close the following streets - Grove Hill Ave. and Trail Grove, North View and West Lanes, at petitioner's expense, was read and referred to the Attorney for an opinion.

A communication from the San Anselmo Fire Department urging Council to appoint R. Meagor assistant to Chief Engineer Marcucci was read and referred to the Fire Committee.

The communication of Mrs. A. Carlisle, 74 Forest Ave. Lansdale, commending the Fire boys for the manner in which the fire of August 2nd was handled was read and placed on file.

The Chairman of the Park Committee recommended that the trees in the sidewalk area at the entrance to Sequoia Park be not removed, stating that necessary room could be provided in a different manner.

Councilman Siemer introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

"RESOLVED by the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo that the following street and part thereof: viz: RAYMOND AVE. AT THE INTERSEC. OF KEMP AVE. is hereby declared to constitute a Boulevard, and as such, to be within and subject to the provisions of Ordinance No. 207 regulating traffic upon the public streets of the Town of San Anselmo."

Resolution was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright & Fusselman
NOES: None.

1930-31 TAX RATE:

Upon motion of Councilman McKannay, the tax rate of the Town of San Anselmo (excluding Hawthorn Hills District) for the fiscal year 1930-31 was fixed at \$1.77 per \$100. valuation and the Hawthorn Hills Addition tax rate for said year was fixed at \$1.10 per \$100. valuation.

Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilman Jordan.

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman the proposition of D. Prola to dump garbage on the Dias Ranch, San Anselmo, in the event that the Garbage Franchise was awarded to him was accepted.

Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and failed to carry by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Fusselman and Wright.
Noes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer and Jordan.

Thereafter, the entire matter was laid over until the next meeting of the Board.

WARRANTS:

Upon motion of Councilman McKannay, the following warrants were ordered paid out of the 1929 Fire Protection Bond Fund: 688-734-737-739-748-750-751 and 771; also that the following warrants chargeable to the general fund be O.K'd. as to amounts and ordered forwarded without approval on account of lack of funds: 670 to 672 incl., 676-677-679 to 681 incl.; 684-687-689-690-692-693-695-720-735-736-740 to 747 incl.; 749-752 to 770 incl. and 772 to 779 incl.

Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Wright and Fusselman.
Councilman Jordan declined to vote.

Upon motion of Councilman Siemer, the Chairman of the City Council was authorized to execute a deed conveying a parcel of land on Saunders Ave. to R. A. Carey, for a consideration of \$700. Motion was seconded by Councilman McKannay and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

The Council canvassed the straw ballot in connection with the Tennis Courts and Children's Play Grounds propositions with the result

that a majority (239) favored the construction of four tennis courts only. After some discussion, the matter was laid over until the next meeting of the Council.

The reports of the Building Inspector and Fire Chief for the month of August were read and placed on file.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to Monday, October 6th, 1930, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

The Clerk was directed to advise the proprietors of the Tamarin Golf course that a vote of thanks was extended them for their splendid improvement.
