A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, October 6th, 1930, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

PETITIONS:

The petition of Mrs. F. Whelan for the Council to investigate sewer conditions in Essex Street was read and referred to the Parks & Housing Committee.

The petition of Eleanor V. Robson and others for the installation of a street light at the corner of Oak Knoll and Florence Aves., Lansdale, was read and referred to the Light Committee for investigation.

Permission was granted Mark E. Noon to remove one tree in the sidewalk area at 38 San Rafael Ave.

COMMUNICATIONS:

A letter from the Gamewell Fire Alarm Co. advising Council that an inspection of the newly installed Fire Alarm System had been made and passed the necessary tests was read and placed on file.

A communication signed Lulu L. Maddux, 44 Barber Ave. San Anselmo, advising Council of an accident which befell her sister and

which she claims was due to carelessness on the part of the Water District during recent excavation for the replacement of a fire hydrant opposite the Standard Oil Service Station was read and referred to the Police Dept. for investigation.

Thereafter, upon motion of Councilman Fusselman, Stanley Doyle was appointed as such officer at a salary of \$150. per month and that Officer John Oram be notified that his position as night patrolman would be abolished on November 1st, 1930. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion of Councilman McKannay, Councilman Jordan was authorized to purchase a new conveyor belt for the street sweeper for the sum of \$273.00.
