MINUTES OF OCTOBER 22, 1930.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Wednesday, October 22nd, 1930, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 95 - KARLSHRUE PARK:

This being the time set for the hearing of protests against the work to be done under Resolution of Intention No. 95 of this Council, and no written protests having been filed with the Clerk, Councilman Jordan introduced a Resolution ordering the work and directing the Clerk to advertise for bids and moved its adoption. Resolution was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Thereupon, Councilman Jordan introduced a Resolution ordering the work to be done under the direction of the Engineer instead of the Superintendent of Streets, and moved its adoption. Resolution was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Noes: None.

Thereafter, Councilman Jordan introduced a Resolution directing that assessment be made and signed by the Engineer instead of the Superintendent of Streets and moved its adoption. Resolution was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Noes: None.

PETITIONS:

The petitions of V. Peters of Agatha Court, and Harold W. Klarud and others on Floribel Ave., for the installation of lights, were read and referred to the Street Committee for recommendation.

The petition of Calvin Von Staden, No. 125 Pine St., for a sidewalk on the bridge fronting his property was referred to the Street Committee and Engineer for consideration.

The petition of Mr. Wessel for the moving of a fire hydrant from its present location at the S.W. corner of Ross and San Anselmo Avenues to a point 50 feet west on Ross Ave. was referred to the Fire Committee.

The petition of Mrs. Mary Fortina for the removal of a tree in the sidewalk area fronting her property at 54 Ross Ave., and permission to build a new concrete driveway into her property, was referred to the Parks and Housing Committee for consideration.

The matter of the appointment of an inspector to work with the Pacific Gas & Electric Co. in connection with its annual tree trimming program in the Town was referred to Councilman Siemer.

The matter of dedicating and acceptance of a certain street leading from Sturdivant Ave. in the Barber Tract was taken under advisement by the Council.

A communication from the Marin Municipal Water District advising Council that it will proceed with the work in connection with the installation of a pumping plant opposite Lot "B" in the Rosenthal Tract as soon as the necessary deed conveying tank site to the district is in their possession was read and placed on file.

Upon motion of Councilman Jordan, the resignation of Sturgis B. Whitwell, City Judge, was accepted. Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Noes: None. The Clerk was instructed to advise Mr. Whitwell of Council's appreciation for past services rendered by him.

Thereafter, a ballot was taken on the two following candidates who were placed in nomination for the office of City Judge, with the following results:

For Hiliary Crawford, Councilmen McKannay and Siemer.
For Geo. Washburn, Councilmen Jordan and Wright.

~~that the City Attorney would flip a coin and the Clerk calling the right turn, Mr. Washburn would win; failing to do so, Mr. Crawford would win. Thereafter, the coin was flipped and the Clerk having called the turn, Mr. Washburn was appointed City Judge.~~

Upon motion of Councilman Siemer, seconded by Councilman McKannay, Mr. Washburn's appointment was made unanimous.

Councilman Siemer reported on the sewer condition along Essex Street, recommending that immediate steps be taken to remedy the situation. Thereafter, the Chair appointed Councilmen Siemer and Jordan and the Engineer to confer with the property owners in the district in regard to the installation of an adequate lateral in the street.

Councilman Siemer introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption.

"Resolved by the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo that it is for the best interests of said Town that the bonds for the construction of the Golden Gate Bridge be enthusiastically endorsed by the Voters of said Town on November 4th, 1930, and that all possible co-operation be given the Golden Gate Bridge District to bring this great project to completion."

Resolution was seconded by Councilman Jordan and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Jordan, the matter of building tennis courts in the City Park was laid over for a period of six months. Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilman Siemer.

Councilman McKannay not voting.

A vote of thanks was extended to Dr. and Mrs. A.T. Derby and C. B. Herrod for their co-operation in the installation of the Police beacon on Red Hill and the Clerk was instructed to advise them accordingly.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Monday, November 3rd, 1930.
