There being no further business, a vote was taken for adjournment with the following result:

Ayes: Councilmen Siemer and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilmen Jordan and Wright.

A deadlock apparently resulting, Councilman Siemer left the meeting and was followed shortly thereafter by Councilman Fusselman, leaving the Council without a quorum; thereupon the meeting was automatically adjourned.

MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 19, 1930.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Wednesday, November 19th, 1930, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright & Fusselman
Absent: None. Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

ORDINANCE NO. 282:

An Ordinance imposing license fees on businesses, etc. transacted in the Town of San Anselmo, which was presented for first reading at the meeting of November 5th, 1930, was referred to the Finance Committee for further consideration. It was agreed that the Chairman of said Committee would confer with a committee of businessmen of the Town with a view to making certain changes therein, reporting back to the Council before any further action is taken.

APPOINTMENT OF RELIEF MAN IN THE FIRE AND POLICE DEPARTMENTS:

A ballot was taken on the names of Thomas Lynch and Bert Meagor for the position of Relief man in the Fire and Police Depts. with the following result:

For Thos. J. Lynch - Councilmen McKannay, Siemer and Fusselman.
For Bert Meagor - Councilmen Jordan and Wright.

Thereafter, Thomas J. Lynch received the appointment at a salary of \$150. per month and was instructed to report for duty on November 20th, 1930.

The petition of S. Weber and Fred Berger for relief from drainage water running off the Sleepy Hollow watershed onto their property was referred to the Street Committee for investigation. Similar action was taken on the petition of Mrs. Reckart, #150 Woodland Ave. for street repairs.

The application of Thomas J. Lynch for the position of Relief man in the Police and Fire Departments was received and placed on file.

The Superintendent of Streets was instructed to paint, with white paint, the curbing at the intersection of Sycamore and Red Hill Aves.

The Clerk was directed to acknowledge with thanks the communication of Andrew M. Jensen, dated October 29th, 1930, advising him that the Town has already been zoned, although the Council extends him a cordial invitation to appear before them at any meeting and speak on the subject of City Zoning.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Monday, December 1st, 1930, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.
