A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, May 4th, 1931, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

The petition of Mr. Pike concerning the display signs in front of his store at 100 Red Hill Ave. was read and petitioner was granted permission to place such signs as long as they do not interfere with pedestrians.

The petition of Mrs. Siemer and others for the installation of a warning sign on Calumet Ave. near the Rhodes property was referred to the Superintendent of Streets for investigation, with instructions to report back at the meeting of May 12th.

A communication from the Hewitt-Gutta Percha Rubber Corp. with reference to the returning of certain fire hose was read and the matter was referred to the Fire Committee.

A communication signed A. Mansie concerning the spite fence between his and Schuler's property was read and tabled. The Chairman advised Mr. Mansie that the Town would take no further part in the controversy.

A communication signed Clyde F. Reid, 54 Park Way, San Anselmo, calling Council's attention to several large dead pine trees on a vacant lot adjoining his, ~~constituting a public nuisance~~, was read and the matter was referred to the Parks & Housing Committee for investigation.
