MINUTES OF JUNE 9TH, 1931.

An adjourned meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, June 9th, 1931, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Absent: Councilman McKannay.

Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meetings of May 12th and June 1st, 1931 were approved as read.

The petition of Harvey E. Nelson for a light on the first pole east of his furniture store on Greenfield Ave. was referred to the Lighting Committee for recommendation.

The petition of the Morningside Court Improvement Club for action concerning removal of certain obstructions in the Creek south of the bridge in the Cordone property was referred to the Superintendent of Streets for investigation.

A communication from the Chairman of the Community Betterment Committee of the American Legion, requesting Council to approve

its plan concerning the change in the name of the Red Hill Ave. and Main Street to "Sir Francis Drake Highway" was read and placed on file. Thereafter, upon motion of Councilman Wright, seconded by Councilman Siemer, the proposition was endorsed by the following vote:

A communication signed Clyde F. Reed, 54 Park Way, Sequoia Park, San Anselmo, concerning fire hazards in said Park was received and placed on file.

Honorable City Council,

 Gentlemen:

By virtue of the authority vested in me under Section 880 of Act 5233 of the General Laws of the State of California, and with the concurrence of the President of the City Council, on May 30-1931, G.D. Vickery was appointed to the position of traffic officer to fill that position during the temporary absence of Officer Reynolds, who was injured on that date.

I herewith request your Honorable Council to verify this appointment and to authorize the proper compensation for his services.

Permission was granted the Chief of Police to make necessary arrangements for relief during the vacation periods.

The reports of the Fire Chief, Fire Marshal and Building Inspector for the month of May were received and placed on file.

The petition of C. D. von Staden and others, for sidewalks along the northerly and southerly lines of Pine Street, for its entire length, was referred to the Clerk for checking.

Similar action was taken on the petition of Ralph Asay and others for pavement at the intersection of Red Hill Avenue and San Francisco Boulevard.

RESOLUTION CONFIRMING ASSESSMENT (ESSEX ST. NO. 96):

This being the time set for the hearing of protests against

assessment described in Resolution of Intention No. 96 of this Council, and no protests haveing been filed with the Clerk, Councilman Wright introduced a Resolution confirming assessment and ordering warrant, and moved its adoption. Resolution was seconded by Councilman Jordan and carried by the following vote:

An Ordinance providing for the removal and destruction of rubbish, weeds, brush, grass and other rank growth on lots, premises and sidewalks in the Town of San Anselmo was presented for final reading and was passed and adopted by the following vote:

Thereafter, the Ordinance was signed by the Mayor and numbered 213.

ORDINANCE NO. 214 (ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF TAXES):

An Ordinance adding Section 26A to an Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance providing for the assessment, levy and collection of Taxes", was presented for final reading and was passed and adopted by the following vote:

The Clerk was directed to communicate with the various Service Clubs and organizations of San Anselmo urging them to cooperate with Council in requesting financial support from the County Supervisors for the paving of the shoulders of Red Hill Ave. for its entire length through the town.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, July 14th, 1931, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.
