The Chief of Police was directed to investigate alleged illegal parking and other nuisances on Magnolia Ave. opposite the home of Mrs. Shehan, who reported the matter to the Board.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, August 11th, 1931, at 8 o'clock P.M.

MINUTES OF AUGUST 11TH, 1931.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, August 11, 1931 at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen McKannay, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Absent: Councilman Siemer.

Upon motion of Councilman Wright, seconded by Councilman Jordan, Councilman McKannay was appointed Clerk Pro Tem. by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.
Absent: Councilman Siemer.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

READING OF COMMUNICATIONS:

Upon motion of Councilman Wright, seconded by Councilman Jordan, the letter from Pacific Gas & Electric Co. regarding the cutting of Huntington Elms in the Barber Tract was read and referred to Councilman Siemer for a detailed plan and map of the extent of cutting necessary.

A letter from Samuel Zacharonsky regarding business license tax on the collection of tallow and hides from the local butchers was referred

to the individual members of the Council for investigation and to be brought up at the next meeting.

A bid of Thirty-five Dollars was opened for the Chevrolet touring car owned by the Town and upon motion by Councilman Jordan, the Chief of Police was authorized to sell same for the best price and not less than Thirty five dollars. Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

The letter from Marin Credit Association with reference to complaints of numerous business people regarding the new business license ordinance was read and the matter was referred to the Town Attorney and the Chief of Police for an appropriate reply covering the points requested.

A deed from the Carrigan Tract Company covering Lot 2, Blk. E. of the Carrigan Tract was offered by the Tax Collector for acceptance by the Council. Upon advice from the Town Attorney that the 1915 Bond Act provides that where there is delinquent street assessments against a piece of property, it is necessary for the Council to order suit to be brought in the Superior Court to foreclose the lien, and that this condition existed and applied to the aforementioned piece of property, upon motion of Councilman Jordan the deed was rejected for the reasons above mentioned and same was returned to the Carrigan Tract Company with a letter of thanks for their co-operation, and advising them of the reasons for rejecting such deed. Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion duly made and carried, similar action was taken on the deed from Wisee J. Bertram covering Lot 275 of the Short Ranch.

The matter of the painting of the Library Building at this time to conform with the Town Hall was referred to the Finance Committee for consideration in making up the Library Tax.

Councilman McKannay introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

"WHEREAS, there appears on the official records of the Town of San Anselmo, and more particularly described in the delinquent tax roll, the following described property, to-wit:

1. Lot 2, Blk.E, as per Map of Carrigan Tract.

2. Lot 275, as per Map of Short Ranch Tract Subdivision 2.
3. Portion Lot 13, lying N. of 40' rd. and W. of Lot of Leiderman, also ptn. Lot 14 lying N. of 40' rd. bd. S. W. by Lot H; N.W. by Lot 17; E. by Lot 13; Contg. 1.41 acres. Also tct. ld. bd. N. by 40' rd. E. by ld. of Wegman; S. by Oak Ave. S.W. by ld. of Carey, Bertin and Berlin; N.W. by Lot I, except Spring lot of J.C. Raas, Contg. 3.92 acres,

upon which has been assessed certain street assessments, and said assessments with interest and penalties accruing under the taxation ordinance of the Town of San Anselmo have not been paid, and

WHEREAS, the Improvement Bond Act of 1915 as amended provides that the City Council may order the same to be collected by suit brought in the Superior Court to foreclose the lien thereof,

IT IS NOW THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Town Attorney be, and he is hereby directed to institute the necessary legal proceedings to collect said delinquent assessments, with interest, penalties and costs, as by Statute provided."

Resolution was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Noes: None.

Absent: Councilman Siemer.

Councilman McKannay introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

"RESOLVED by the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo that hereafter Main Street, from the Southerly boundary line of said Town, Northerly to its intersection with the Northerly line of Red Hill Avenue, and Red Hill Avenue from its intersection with the Easterly line of Main Street Westerly to the Westerly boundary line of said Town, shall be officially known as, and called, 'Sir Francis Drake Boulevard'". Thereafter the Supt. of Streets was instructed to make the necessary changes in the street signs.

Resolution was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by

the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Noes: None.

Absent: Councilman Siemer.

Reports of the Building Inspector and Fire Chief were read and ordered filed.

By unanimous vote of the Council, the Clerk was instructed to write a letter to the City Council of Ross thanking them for the prompt and efficient assistance rendered in the fire which occurred on August 9, 1931 in San Anselmo near the Ross line.

Authority was granted Councilman Jordan to purchase a new motor complete and installed in the Town truck for a price not to exceed the sum of \$157.50.

The matter of compensation insurance for volunteer firemen was brought up by Councilman Wright and after some discussion on the subject it was referred back to Councilman Wright for a detailed report at the next meeting.

Upon motion of Councilman McKannay, Warrants Nos. 50 to 115 inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
 Noes: None.
 Absent: Councilman Siemer.

Councilman McKannay introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

"RESOLVED that the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo hereby expresses its sincere appreciation of the earnest efforts by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marin to secure for said County the Bombing Base for the U. S. War Department and urgently requests said Board to continue in its efforts to the end that said Base may be finally located in said County; and further

RESOLVED that this Council assures said Board that it does and will fully support said Board in its efforts towards the accomplishment of said object which will be of such great benefit to the County of Marin."

Resolution was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
 Noes: None.
 Absent: Councilman Siemer.

Jack Sheehy and a committee from the American Legion brought up the matter of a fire alarm siren and he was instructed to send in an estimate and complete report to the Finance Committee for their consideration in making up the Budget.

Mr. McPherson of the Oakland-California Towel Co. appeared before the Council to protest the business license tax of \$20. required from his Company to make deliveries in San Anselmo and requested a reduction in this rate. After a brief discussion, such request was refused, the Council informing Mr. McPherson that a careful study of the whole matter had been made by a large committee of local business men over a period of six months and that the present Ordinance was drafted at their request and the matter was closed.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, September 8, 1931 at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.
