Minutes of January 12th, 1932.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, Jan. 12th, 1932, at the hour of 8 o'clock, p.m.

PRESENT: Councilmen McKannay, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
ABSENT: " Siemer.

Councilman Fusselman Presiding. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

PETITIONS: The petition of Miss. G. E. Torres, No. 8 Redwood Road, for relief from storm waters was read and referred to the Street Committee for investigation.

The petition of Robt. A. Carey, representing property owners in his district, for the changing of the name of Oak Ave to Oak Road and also for the installation of a light in front of the MCEcheran gate on said Ave., was read and referred to the Street Committee. No action was taken on the matter of changing the name of Oak Ave. and the light was ordered installed.

The petition of H. O. Simpson, Short Ranch, for the removal of certain trees standing on Town property, was received and placed on file and the Clerk was instructed to advise the writer that the matter will be investigated and if deemed hazardous, such trees will be removed.

It was agreed that the Street Committee, Engineer and Supt. of Streets view the following drainage problems, gather all possible data concerning the costs of proper repairs etc. and report back at the next meeting of the Council:

On Sir Francis Drake Blvd. in front of the Orphanage, Oak Ave., Forest Ave., Butterfield Road and Redwood Road just South of San Anselmo Ave.

A communication from the P. G. & E. Co. in reference to trimming of trees along the south side of Ross Ave. was read and referred to Councilman Siemer.

A communication was received from the Northwestern Pacific Railroad Co. submitting detailed drawings of proposed Wigwag Signal to be installed at the Tunstead Ave. crossing. After some discussion the matter was held over for further consideration.

Councilman McKannay introduced the following Resolution

and moved its adotion;

"Request having been made to the City Clerk of the Town of San Anselmo that Steet Assessments against property shown on the assessment roll as Lot 3 and portion of Lot 4, lying south of Oak Avenue, also all of lots B & E, also Ely. 2.55 Acres of G, in the Rosenthal Tract San Anselmo, Marin County, California, be segregated and reapportioned due to the subdivision and change of ownership;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo that Donald T. Wood, Superintendant of Streets be, and is hereby ordered to file with the Clerk of the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo, a report and amended assessments of the original parcels of land affected by the subdivision and change of ownership, segregating and apportioning the unpaid installments of said portions of said original parcels of land.

Upon motion duly made and carried the Attorney was instructed to prepare an Ordinance concerning the placing of stop-cocks on all gas installations in the vicinity of the curb line.

The Supt. of Streets was instructed to have and Electrollier

installed at Broadmoor Ave and Morningside Drive, in Subdivision No. 2, Morningside Court.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the Assessor was authorized to cancel the seconded installment of taxes levied against eight separate parcels of real estate appearing of record on the 1931-32 Assessment Roll.

The reports of the Fire Chief and Marshal and the Building Inspector were received and placed on file.
