MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 9, 1932.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, February 9th, 1932, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Upon motion of Councilman Siemer, the Chief of Police was authorized to place Officer Reynolds back to day traffic duty as soon as a good and sufficient bond is given to protect the interests of the Chief of Police and also when a complete report is received by him from the State Compensation Insurance Fund stating fully Officer Reynolds' status in connection with his return to duty. Motion was seconded by Councilman McKannay and carried by the following vote:
