



MINUTES OF MEETING FEB. 18, 1932.

A Special Meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Thursday, February 18, 1932, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Absent: None.
Councilman Fusselman presiding.

Upon motion of Councilman Jordan, Councilman Siemer was appointed Clerk Pro Tem. Motion was seconded by Councilman McKannay and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with.

Upon motion of Councilman McKannay, the Attorney was instructed to draw a lease contract covering the purchase of several parcels of land in connection with the contemplated extension of Cedar Street from Tunstead to Tamalpais Ave., at the following prices: Mrs. Stenzel's property, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.); Mrs. Wyatt's property, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$800.) and Mrs. Wynne's property, Twenty-five Hundred Dollars (\$2500.) Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Wright, the Finance Committee was instructed to confer with the local banks with a view to obtaining best possible terms in connection with the purchase of above mentioned real estate. Motion was seconded by Councilman McKannay and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.
Absent: Councilman Jordan.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Clerk was directed to communicate with the San Anselmo Lion's Club advising them that a unanimous vote of thanks was extended the Organization for its efforts in bringing the Cedar Street extension matter to a head.

MINUTES OF MARCH 8TH, 1932.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, March 8th, 1932, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Absent: None.

Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meetings of February 9th and 18th, 1932 were approved as read.

A communication signed Mrs. S. Charick, 88 Elm Ave. reporting a fire hazard on a lot in the rear of her property was read and referred to the Parks & Housing Committee with authority to act.

Similar action was taken on the matter of proposed tree trimming along Crescent Road, as outlined in a communication received from

Kernan Robson.

The resignation of Dr. O. W. Jones, as Trustee of the Marin County Mosquito Abatement District No. 1 was read. The matter was held over until the next meeting of the Council.

Upon motion of Councilman Wright, the Chief of Police was authorized to sell a 1928 Model Motorcycle belonging to the Town to Dudley Perkins, for the sum of \$100. Motion was seconded by Councilman Siemer and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman,
Noes: None.

Councilman Jordan introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

"RESOLVED, by the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo, Marin County, California, that in the opinion of said City Council, the public interest or necessity demands the creation and maintenance of a Municipal Utility District, to be known as 'Marin Municipal Ferries Utility District', composed of the municipalities of San Rafael, Belvedere, Mill Valley, Corte Madera, Larkspur, Ross, San Anselmo and Fairfax, in the County of Marin, State of California, together with all of the unincorporated territory within said County of Marin, the exterior boundaries of said proposed district (including said municipalities) being as follows, to-wit:
All of that portion of the County of Marin, bounded on the West by the Pacific Ocean, on the North and East by the County of Sonoma and San Pablo Bay, and on the South by San Francisco Bay and the municipality of Sausalito.

The kind of utility proposed to be first acquired shall be a passenger, freight and vehicular system of ferries to ply between the City and County of San Francisco and the County of Marin, together with rail road or bus transportation for passengers and freight, connecting the Marin
