MINUTES OF JULY 12, 1932.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, July 12th, 1932, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen McKannay, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.  
 Absent: None.

Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of June 14th were approved as read.

The annual report of the Library Board for the year ending June 30th, 1932 was read and placed on file and it was regularly moved and carried that the Clerk acknowledge receipt of same and inform the Secretary that a vote of thanks was extended the Board for the efficient manner in which the affairs of the Library have been conducted and also that their request for operating expenses for the coming year will be granted.

Upon motion of Councilman McKannay, Miss V. Ansel and Fred Carpenter were reappointed members of the Library Board for another term and the Clerk was directed to inform them of the Council's action.

No <sup>action</sup> motion was taken on the gasoline and oil bids received from the following Companies: Signal Service, Inc.,

The prices offered by The Texas Company being the lowest, upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the Chief of Police was instructed to purchase from them the necessary gasoline and oil. Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT FIRE CHIEF:

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, Ambrose Ferrario was appointed Assistant to the Fire Chief, at a salary of \$140. per month, such appointment to become effective July 1st, 1932.

Councilman Jordan objecting, moved that no action be taken on such appointment; thereupon a vote was taken, with the following result:

Thereafter, Councilman McKannay seconded the motion offered by Councilman Scotford in regard to the appointment of Ferrario and the matter carried by the following vote:

Noes: Councilmen Jordan and Wright.

Councilman McKannay reported a surplus of \$4,523.94 in the General Fund, at the close of the present fiscal year and moved that warrants Nos. 782 to 845, inclusive, be paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen McKannay, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.  
Noes: None.

Mr. Carl Luhrs, representing Morningside Court Improvement Club, petitioned the Council to have the creek running through said district cleared of brush and debris, also for the removal of the rock barrier in the creek and the installation of siphons to storm drain outlets under the bridges, before the rainy season sets in.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to Tuesday, August 9th, 1932, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.
