MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 9, 1932.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, November 9th, 1932, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Absent: None.

Councilman Fusselman in the Chair.

Before proceeding Councilman Wright challenged the right of Councilman's seat on the Board. Thereafter, the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved by a majority of the Board, Councilman Jordan, however, objecting to such approval and questioning Councilman Dempsey's status as a Councilman. The Chair ruling that Councilman Dempsey was a duly and regularly appointed Councilman, and having a legal right to sit on the Board unless the Courts may determine otherwise, proceeded with the regular order of business.

Both Councilmen Jordan and Wright declined to enter general objections to all of the proceedings of the meeting, stating that they would raise such objections as they saw fit during the course of the meeting.

The petition of Modesto Pinza to have his property (Southerly half of Lot 14 and Southwesterly one-quarter of Lot 15), Linda Vista Tract) excluded from the present fire zone was read and referred to the Council for consideration.

The matter of reducing the insurable value of the Ball Park Grandstand from \$1500 to \$500, as suggested by the Insurance Company of North America was referred to the Parks and Housing and Finance Committees.

A letter from the P.G. & E. Company requesting authority to trim trees in San Anselmo in accordance with its annual practice was read and referred to the Parks and Housing Committee. Similar action was taken on the petition of John Bulatti requesting Council to remove a bay tree from the street area fronting Lots 78 and 79, Yolanda Court.

The reports of the Fire Marshal, Fire Chief and Building Inspector for the month of October, 1932 were received and placed on file.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, Warrants Nos. 190 to 251, inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

Councilman Wright challenged the vote of Councilman Dempsey on the passage of said warrants.

Council's attention having been called to certain cracks appearing in the pavement between the gutter and street in Karlshrue Park Tract, the Chair instructed the Street Committee and Superintendent of Streets to view the affected territory and make the necessary repairs.
