Council's attention having been called to certain cracks appearing in the pavement between the gutter and street in Karlshue Park Tract, the Chair instructed the Street Committee and Superintendent of Streets to view the affected territory and make the necessary repairs.

MINUTES OF DECEMBER 13, 1932.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, December 13, 1932, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Before calling the Roll, Councilman Wright challenged the right of Councilman Dempsey to sit on the Board as a Member of the Council.

Present: Councilman Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

Absent: None.

Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The minutes of the meeting of October 11th were read and approved by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford and Fusselman.
Councilmen Wright and Jordan not voting.

The petition of I. Bianchini and others for the installation of a light on the Alameda was read and referred to the Chairman of the Street Committee for consideration.

The communication from the Morningside Court Improvement Club urging Council to take immediate action to prevent a recurrence of flood conditions in both bridge areas in Morningside Court was read and after some discussion, Councilman Jordan was authorized to employ the Engineer to run levels along the creek in Morningside Court, at a cost of approximately

\$20. with a view to determining just what steps should be taken to remedy the existing condition.

The communication from the American Legion requesting permission to decorate and install electroliers on the Main Street Bridge at their own expense was read and such request was granted; the Clerk was so instructed to advise the writer.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the request of the Chairman of the Community Betterment^{Committee}/of the Local Post of the American Legion, to have the existing Parking Ordinance strictly enforced was tabled for the reason that the matter had not been properly brought before, or acted upon, by the Legion. Motion was seconded by Councilman Jordan and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Councilman Dempsey introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

"WHEREAS, it is evident that municipalities within the State of California have not received a fair proportion of the motor tax funds with which to construct and maintain streets and highways required by increasing automobile traffic, and

WHEREAS, a more equitable distribution of said funds is necessary and desirable,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT THE City of San Anselmo go on record as favoring the following:

1. The apportionment to each county as heretofore of one-third of the total proceeds of the existing three cent motor fuel tax; however, the amount accruing directly from the tax on the sale of gasoline shall be apportioned amongst the cities of said county and the unincorporated areas of said county on the basis of registration of motor vehicles. Of said apportionment, three-fourths of the amount resulting from city registration shall be paid to the cities; the remaining one-fourth resulting from city registration, together with all revenue resulting from rural registration and all receipts for license plates, etc., shall be paid into the county treasury. The same restrictions on expenditures shall be made for the cities as now exists for the counties, with the further provision that all such funds shall be expended only according to a financial plan in each case which shall be based upon a competent physical plan, including a classification of existing traffic routes and proposed alterations therein and extensions thereto.

2. Nothing in the resolution shall be construed to limit the existing authority of counties to meet needs within incorporated cities."

Resolution was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.

A communication from the Pacific Coast Building Officials Conference was received and referred to the Parks and Housing Committee.

A letter from Chief Engineer Bush of the Board of Fire

Underwriters, addressed to the Chairman of the Fire Committee, approving the newly installed compressed air fire siren which was tested by them, on Sunday, December 11th, was read and the Clerk was directed to acknowledge the receipt of same.

Upon motion of Councilman Wright, the Chairman of the Street Committee was authorized to construct a guard rail along the sidewalk on San Anselmo Ave. at the foot of Tamalpais Ave. at a cost not to exceed \$40. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and
Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Upon recommendation of Councilman Dempsey and Wright the insurance policy covering the Grand Stand at the Ball Park was reduced from \$1500 to \$750 and the Clerk was directed to advise the local agent of such action.

The petition of Carl Durham bearing several hundred signatures of residents and taxpayers, approving the proposed alterations of his building was read and the petitioner was advised to apply to the Building Inspector for a permit.

The Chairman of the Fire Committee reported on the try-out and tests of the new fire siren which were approved by the Underwriters on Sunday, December 11th, and upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, the Chairman of the Fire Committee was authorized to purchase such siren at the agreed price. Motion was seconded by Councilman Fusselman and carried by the following vote:

The Chairman of the Street Committee was authorized to install a light in the 1400 block on Sir Francis Drake Blvd.
