ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 155 (TAXES):

An Ordinance amending Sec. 20 of Ordinance No. 155, entitled "An Ordinance providing for the assessment, levy and collection of taxes in the Town of San Anselmo" was presented for first reading and was read.

A communication signed Bert E. Nickerson, petitioning Council to reduce the assessed valuation of his property in Hawthorn Hills was read and the Clerk was instructed to advise the writer to appear before the Board of Equalization on the 2nd Monday in August, at which time his request will be considered.

A communication signed by the Secretary of the Marin Co. Planning Commission inviting Council to attend the next meeting of the Commission to be held on May 8th, 1933, at 1 P.M. in the Supervisor's chambers, was read and the Clerk was instructed to advise the Secretary that as many members as possible will be in attendance.

A communication from Mr. C. A. Luhrs, President of the Morningside Court Improvement Club, calling Council's attention to traffic conditions, speeding, breaking down of pavements, etc., due to heavily laden commercial vehicles, was read and placed on file.

The Chief of Police was instructed to make a personal investigation of the complaint and to warn operators of such vehicles that arrests will follow persistent violators of traffic rules and regulations in said district.

It was suggested that all trucking from the Marin Rock Co's quarry should be routed over Butterfield Road instead of Broadmoor Ave.

Councilman Scotford introduced the following report:

"As Chairman of the Fire and Police Committee, I have nothing to report, other than to refute a series of rumors which are being circulated around the town by various individuals in respect to Chief of Police Wood, to the effect that he has been dismissed from the service, that he has been ordered not to wear his uniform for six months, that he is on probation, and other rumors of like nature.

These rumors are entirely without foundation. The Fire and Police Committee at no time have had any reason to criticize his actions as Chief of Police nor have they ever given consideration to any of the steps so rumored. Mr. Wood's conduct of his office is entirely satisfactory to the Committee who commend him very highly on the efficient manner in which he is handling the work of his department.

I make this statement in order to fully inform members of this Board that the rumors are entirely unwarranted, and I desire to have this statement made a record in the minutes of this meeting."
