MINUTES OF MAY 9TH, 1933.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, May 9th, 1933, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan and Fusselman.

Absent: Councilman Wright.

Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the two previous meeting were read and approved.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, the proprietor of the Piggly Wiggly was granted a permit to sell vinous or malt beverages containing not more than 3.2 per cent of alcohol by weight. Motion was seconded by Councilman Jordan and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan and Fusselman.

Noes: None.

Absent: Councilman Wright.

Upon motion of Councilman Jordan, the Chairman of the Fire Committee was authorized to purchase such 6 ply one inch American Rubber Co's. chemical hose as is needed, also to install and paint such new windows in the Fire House as are necessary. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion of Councilman Jordan, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to make certain cuts in the pavement and curbing at Sir Francis Drake Blvd. and Tunstead Ave., along Tunstead Ave. in front of the American Trust Co.'s Bank and also at the Ross Ave. crossing in connection with the installation of new wig-wag signals at said locations. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

A representative of the P.G. & E. Co. addressed the Council and agreed to replace any faulty work done by the Company after installation of

gas mains, etc. and agreed in the future to carefully replace any pavement they find necessary to disturb in the laying of such mains.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, a blanket authorization was given the Superintendent of Streets to outline a repair program to be done under his supervision. Motion was seconded by Councilman Jordan and carried by the following vote:

An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 162, as amended by Ordinance No. 175, and as further amended by Ordinance No. 192, by repealing certain sections thereof", was presented for final reading, was read, passed and adopted by the following vote:

ORDINANCE NO. 220 (COMMERCIAL ZONING):

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 190, entitled, "An Ordinance regulating and establishing the location of trades, industries, businesses, and dwellings in the Town of San Anselmo, and the location of buildings designed for the specific uses, establishing districts or zones and the boundaries thereof for said purposes, and providing penalties for the violation of this Ordinance", approved June 7th, 1926, as amended by adding thereto a new section in 3-D, extending the commercial districts in said Town, was presented for final reading, was read, passed and adopted by the following vote:

The Ordinance was then signed by the Mayor and numbered 220.

ORDINANCE NO. 221 (EXCLUDING PROPERTY FROM FIRE ZONE):

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 200, entitled, "An Ordinance creating and establishing fire zones in the Town of San Anselmo", approved September 3, 1929, by adding thereto a new section 2-A, excluding certain property from Fire Zone No. 1, was presented for final reading, was read, passed and adopted by the following vote:

The Ordinance was then signed by the Mayor and numbered 221.

Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

MINUTES OF JUNE 13th, 1933.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, June 13th, 1933, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Absent: None.

The minutes of the meeting of May 9th were approved as read.

A petition signed by F. Lloyd Grandi and others, purporting to be 51% or more tax payers in the district, and requesting Council to re-zone a parcel of land fronting 542 feet on Red Hill Ave. by a depth of 120 feet, was read and the owners of the property in question were granted permission to proceed with certain excavation. The clerk was instructed to check the names of adjacent property owners whose names appear on said petition.

Upon motion of Councilman Jordan, permits for the sale of vinous and malt beverages containing not more than 3.2% of alcohol by weight, were issued to Geo. E. Dixon and C.O. Durham, doing business under the firm name and style of Golden Gate Beverage Co., and Chas. Anderson, proprietor of the Pivoli Cafe. Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by
