MINUTES OF JUNE 13th, 1933.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, June 13th, 1933, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Absent: None.

The minutes of the meeting of May 9th were approved as read.

A petition signed by F. Lloyd Grandi and others, purporting to be 51% or more tax payers in the district, and requesting Council to re-zone a parcel of land fronting 542 feet on Red Hill Ave. by a depth of 120 feet, was read and the owners of the property in question were granted permission to proceed with certain excavation. The clerk was instructed to check the names of adjacent property owners whose names appear on said petition.

Upon motion of Councilman Jordan, permits for the sale of vinous and malt beverages containing not more than 3.2% of alcohol by weight, were issued to Geo. E. Dixon and C.O. Durham, doing business under the firm name and style of Golden Gate Beverage Co., and Chas. Anderson, proprietor of the Pivoli Cafe. Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by

the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Councilman Jordan introduced a Resolution calling for the segregation and reapportioning of certain street assessments covering a portion of Lot E, and the Easterly 2.55 acres of Lot G in the Rosenthal Tract, and moved its adoption. Motion was seconded by Councilman Wright and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

An Ordinance providing for the assessment, levy and collection of taxes, conforming to an Act by the State Legislature, extending time for payment of Taxes, was presented for first reading and was read.

The petition of a group of merchants in San Anselmo requesting a modification in the Ordinance pertaining to business licenses was read and referred to the entire Council for consideration.

The Superintendent of Streets reported on certain street repairs done under his supervision; also that a certain property owner in the Rosenthal Tract has placed barriers and private property notices across an open roadway known as Oak Ave. Upon advice from the City Attorney, the Council instructed the Superintendent of Streets to notify said property owner to remove such barriers and notices from the street area in question.

Upon motion of Councilman Wright, the American Legion was granted a revocable permit to use the City water pipes from the intersection of San Diego Ave. and San Francisco Blvd. to a point adjacent to the Boy Scout's Cabin, several blocks distant therefrom.

The reports of the Fire Chief and Bldg. Inspector for the month of May were received and placed on file.
