MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 14, 1933.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, November 14th, 1933, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

The minutes of the meetings of October 10th, 17th and 18th, 1933 were approved as read.

A communication signed Frank Martincich requesting permission to remove several trees growing on the sidewalk area fronting his property at 707 San Anselmo Avenue was read. Upon motion of Councilman Jordan the matter was referred to the Superintendent of Streets with power to act.

Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

A communication signed H. G. Ridgeway, asking Council's authorization to trim trees in the Town and requesting that an overseer be appointed to supervise such work was read and after some discussion the Clerk was directed to inform Mr. Ridgeway that it was impossible to procure the services of a tree expert at a price of \$5. and that such expert should be obtained owing to the many complaints which are registered each year by property owners of carelessness in trimming trees, and suggesting that \$10 per diem be paid for such work.

The reports of the Building Inspector and Fire Marshal for the month of October, 1933, were received and placed on file.

A communication signed Ebba B. Gray, owner of a parcel of land at 14 Oak Ave., reporting damage to trees caused by the burning of grass, weeds, etc. by the Fire Department last June, was read and placed on file.

A communication bearing signatures of the Mayors of the Cities of Burbank and Lakeport, seeking contributions for legal aid in attempting to reopen the "1915 Bond Act Case", recently decided by the Supreme Court, was read and the Clerk was instructed to advise the writers that the Council will contribute a sum not in excess of \$50. for such purpose.

Upon motion of Councilman Wright, permission was granted Dr. M. H. Layman to raise the present grade of Oak Ave. 6 feet at a point designated and set forth in a diagram accompanying a communication received from her Architect. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:
