

A communication signed Sturgis B. Whitwell, Chairman of the legal committee of San Anselmo Post No. 179, American Legion, urging Council to grant a right of way to the P.G. & E. Co. to lay gas mains, etc. over a strip of Town property, was read and after some discussion Councilman Jordan introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

"RESOLVED that the Town of San Anselmo grant and convey to the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, its successors and assigns, the right and privilege of laying down, inspecting, maintaining and using, as a conduit for conveying gas, a gas main or pipe, and suitable service pipes and connections, together with the right of ingress thereto and egress therefrom, for all purposes connected with the enjoyment of the rights hereby granted, over and across the lands of the grantor, situate in said Town of San Anselmo, and more particularly described as follows:

Lot 426, as said lot is delineated and so designated upon that certain map entitled "Short Ranch Subdivision Two, Marin County, Cal.", and recorded in Book 4 of Maps at Page 22, records of said Marin County.

The route of said conduit across the said lands shall be as follows:

Beginning at a point in the southeasterly boundary line of said Lot 426, distant thereon one foot northeasterly from the most southerly corner of said Lot 426 and running thence northwesterly, parallel with the southwesterly boundary line of said Lot 426, 140 feet, more or less, to a point in the northwesterly boundary line of said Lot 426.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and President of the City Council of said Town and the City Clerk of said Town be and they hereby are authorized and directed to execute in the name of said Town a grant and conveyance to said Pacific Gas and Electric Company in accordance with the terms and intent of this Resolution."

Resolution was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, ~~Scotford~~, Jordan, Lynch and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilman Scotford.

The communication of E. A. Grubert complaining of the practice by certain parties in his neighborhood of storing fertilizer for commercial purposes was read and the matter was taken under advisement by the Council and the Clerk was instructed to so notify the writer.

A communication signed U. H. Iversen and Co., Public Accountants of San Francisco, submitting a proposal to audit the Town books and accounts was read and referred to the Finance Committee for consideration.

The reports of the Building Inspector and Fire Marshal for the month of March were received and placed on file.

Written protests concerning roaming dogs and urging the passage of an ordinance to abate such nuisance were received from the following residents:

MINUTES OF APRIL 16TH, 1934.

An adjourned meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, April 16th, 1934, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: Councilman Jordan.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of April 10th were approved as read.

The Board proceeded to canvass the returns of the General Municipal election held on Monday, April 9th, 1934, and having ascertained the result of the vote cast, Councilman Dempsey introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

"WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the Town of San Anselmo on Monday, April 9th, 1934, as required by law, and

WHEREAS, it appears that notice of said election was held and legally given, that voting precincts were properly established, that election officers were appointed and election supplies were furnished and that in all respects said election was held and conducted and the votes cast thereat received and canvassed and the returns thereof made and declared in the time, form and manner as required by the general laws of the State governing elections in cities of the fifth and sixth class, and

WHEREAS, the Council of said Town met at the Council chambers on Monday, April 16th, 1934, to canvass the returns of said election and install the newly elected officers, as a result of which the Council finds the number of votes cast, the names of the persons voted for and other matters required by law, to be as hereinafter stated:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

That said Municipal Election was held and conducted in the Town of San Anselmo on Monday, April 9th, 1934, in the time, form and manner as required by law; that there were three voting precincts established for the purpose of holding said election, consisting of a consolidation of the regular election precincts established for holding General, State and County Elections, as follows:

Consolidated Voting Precinct "A", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 1-2-3 and 4.

Consolidated Voting Precinct "B", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 5-6-and 7.

Consolidated Voting Precinct "C", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 8-9-10 and 11.

That the whole number of votes cast in said Town was 1044,
