MINUTES OF APRIL 16TH, 1934.

An adjourned meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, April 16th, 1934, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: Councilman Jordan.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of April 10th were approved as read.

The Board proceeded to canvass the returns of the General Municipal election held on Monday, April 9th, 1934, and having ascertained the result of the vote cast, Councilman Dempsey introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

"WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the Town of San Anselmo on Monday, April 9th, 1934, as required by law, and

WHEREAS, it appears that notice of said election was held and legally given, that voting precincts were properly established, that election officers were appointed and election supplies were furnished and that in all respects said election was held and conducted and the votes cast thereat received and canvassed and the returns thereof made and declared in the time, form and manner as required by the general laws of the State governing elections in cities of the fifth and sixth class, and

WHEREAS, the Council of said Town met at the Council chambers on Monday, April 16th, 1934, to canvass the returns of said election and install the newly elected officers, as a result of which the Council finds the number of votes cast, the names of the persons voted for and other matters required by law, to be as hereinafter stated:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

That said Municipal Election was held and conducted in the Town of San Anselmo on Monday, April 9th, 1934, in the time, form and manner as required by law; that there were three voting precincts established for the purpose of holding said election, consisting of a consolidation of the regular election precincts established for holding General, State and County Elections, as follows:

Consolidated Voting Precinct "A", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 1-2-3 and 4.

Consolidated Voting Precinct "B", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 5-6-and 7.

Consolidated Voting Precinct "C", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 8-9-10 and 11.

That the whole number of votes cast in said Town was 1044,

that the names of the persons voted for, the offices for which said persons, together with the whole number of votes which they received in the entire Town are as follows:

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that at said General Municipal Election, T. L. Dempsey, M. Dos Reis, Jr. and Geo. W. Linch were elected to the office of Councilman of the Town of San Anselmo for the full term of four years.

The Clerk shall enter on the records of the Council a statement of the result of the election, showing (1) the whole number of votes cast in said Town, (2) the names of the persons voted for, (3) the office which each person was voted for, (4) number of votes given in each precinct to each of said persons and (5) the number of votes given in said Town to each of said persons.

The Clerk shall thereupon make and deliver to each of the persons elected a certificate of election signed by him and duly authenticated; he shall also impose the Constitutional Oath of office and have them subscribe thereto, whereupon they shall be inducted into the office to which they have been elected."

Motion to adopt said Resolution was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilman Dempsey, Scotford, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.
Absent: Councilman Jordan.

Thereupon the Clerk administered the Constitutional Oath to T. L. Dempsey, M. Dos Reis, Jr. and George W. Linch, who took their seats as Councilmen of the Town of San Anselmo.

The Mayor announced that nomination for the office of President or Chairman of the City Council was in order. Thereupon Councilman Scotford moved that Councilman Fusselman be nominated for such office; said motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey. Councilman Dos Reis moved that nominations be closed and the Clerk was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot in favor of Wm. D. Fusselman, as President or Chairman of the Council. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and unanimously carried.

Thereafter the Chairman re-appointed Councilman Dempsey Chairman of the Finance Committee, with Councilman Scotford as associate member.


Councilman Scotford was re-appointed Chairman of the Police and Fire Committees, with Councilman Dempsey as associate member.

Councilman Dos Reis was appointed Chairman of Parks and Housing Committee, with Councilman Linch as associate member, and Councilman Linch was appointed Chairman of the Street Committee with Councilman Dos Reis as associate member.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, May 8th, 1934, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.
