MINUTES OF APRIL 30, 1934.

At a Special Meeting held in the Town Hall on Monday, April 30, 1934, the following Councilmen were present: Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman. In the absence of the Town Clerk, Councilman Dempsey was appointed acting Clerk.

Representatives of the Marin County Contractors' Association again requested the City Council to pass the Reciprocity Agreement they have presented to the Council, and presented a petition signed by Marin County Contractors' Association, J. O. Dahl, Secretary. This matter was postponed until the regular meeting of the Council to be held May 8th.

The question of the water tank in the vicinity of Sir Francis Dr. Blvd and Redhill Avenues was discussed by members of the Council and referred to the Parks and Housing Committee.

Mayor Fusselman stated that it was his opinion that the Town would receive approximately \$5,000 from the State Highway Department from the quarter cent gasoline tax funds. He also stated it was his opinion that we would receive approximately \$1500 from Marin County as San Anselmo's portion of the gasoline tax funds. On motion of Councilman Scotford the

matter of the handling of the money received from the State to be used for highway purposes was to be referred to the entire Council. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dos Reis and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Linch, Dos Reis and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, Mr. Al Siemer was appointed a special engineer to handle and supervise the work of paving Redhill Avenue upon the receipt of the funds from the State Highway Department. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Yes: Councilman Dempsey, Scotford, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilman Dos Reis.

Councilman Dos Reis reported that the Sanitary District had replaced about thirty feet of broken sewer pipe in Sequoia Drive and that the Sanitary District raised the question as to who was going to pay for the replacing of the pavement.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, May 8th, 1934, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Littlefield, petitioning Council to install a street light on Sequoia Drive, approximately half a block from Alto Avenue.

A communication signed Mrs. J.J. Iredale, 12 Sierra Ave., complaining about roaming dogs in her neighborhood was read and placed on file and the Clerk was instructed to inform writer that the Council has already taken up with the City Attorney the matter of changing the present Dog License Ordinance with a view to taking care of this nuisance.
