MINUTES OF AUGUST 14TH, 1934.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, August 14th, 1934, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: None.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

WARRANTS:

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, Warrants Nos. 708 to 772, incl., were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, the matter of the removal of several trees from the sidewalk area on Sequoia Drive was approved by the Council. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

At this time the Mayor asked permission to leave the meeting and upon motion of Councilman Linch, Councilman Scotford was appointed Chairman pro-tem. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

The communication of Mr. Hensley, 1015 San Anselmo Ave. was read and referred to the Street Committee for investigation. Similar action was

taken on the matter referred to in a communication signed Miss Jamieson.

A petition signed Mr. and Mrs. Caminita concerning the naming of a certain lane in the Ross Valley Park Villa lots, Sub., was received and the Clerk was instructed to advise petitioners that such lane has never been dedicated and accepted by the Town and therefore Council has no jurisdiction in the matter, but if the property owners in the vicinity were agreeable, they could adopt the name suggested and so mark said lane.

The Health Officer reported negligence on the part of some merchants handling foodstuffs in allowing vegetables, etc. to remain on the sidewalks for unreasonable periods of time; also a serious condition caused by faulty sewage disposal in Sequoia Park, both of which matters were discussed and taken under advisement by the Council.

The Attorney was instructed to prepare an amendment to the present Dog License Ordinance, restricting dogs from entering stores throughout the Town and to present same at the next meeting for approval.

The petition of A.U. Welch and others on Laurel Ave., for the condemnation and removal of a dilapidated building at 120 Laurel Ave., was read and placed on file. The said premises and several others in the Town were reported by the Fire Chief to be public nuisances and recommended their removal.

After some discussion, the Clerk was instructed to communicate with the County Supervisors, with the view to ascertaining whether or not they would sanction the razing of such structures, informing them that the several parcels on which said buildings were situate, have already been sold to the Town and State for non-payment of taxes.

The Clerk was instructed to communicate with the Bashful Smith Prining Co., 525 Market Street, San Francisco, asking for a complete list of all tracings of property within the corporate limits of the Town of San Anselmo registered with them either in the Town's name or that of Mr. Geo. W. Manley.

Councilman Dos Reis reported that in his opinion the woodyard now being operated by Carl Lezzeni, constituted a real nuisance, also that the structure he was erecting in connection with said business was in violation of the Building Code and further work thereon had been ordered stopped. Several neighbors appeared before the Council, asking that some action be taken by the Town to abate such nuisance. It was suggested that they circulate a petition among complaining neighbors and present same to the Chief of Police, who will properly present the matter to the Court.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, the position of Miss Cartwright was declared vacant and Mr. Overdick was appointed to said position on a full time basis at an increase of \$125. per month. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

The reports of the Fire Chief and Building Inspector were received and placed on file.
