MINUTES OF AUGUST 28, 1934.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Friday, August 28th, 1934, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.

Absent: None.

Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of August 8th were approved as read.

Upon motion of Councilman Fusselman, the following tax rates for the year 1934-35 were fixed:

A communication from the City Clerk of Mill Valley urging Council to co-operate with the several other incorporated towns in the County to pass and adopt an ordinance declaring cats running at large to be public nuisances, and providing for their destruction and disposal was received and placed on file. No action was taken and the Clerk was instructed to so advise the writer.

The following bids (not called for) were received and placed on file:

Louis Durante and Jack Baken - for the removal of six trees on Sequoia Drive, north of Red Hill Ave.....\$ 90.00, including bond coverage.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, the Superintendent of Streets was instructed to ask for additional bids, accompanied by a bond, for the removal of such trees. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

The petition of Anna T. Hoffman and others for the abatement of a nuisance on the property of Carl Lezzeni was read and placed on file and the matter was referred to the Chief of Police for further action.

The Attorney having consented, on motion of Councilman Scotford, the Clerk was instructed to cancel the 1932-33 tax, together with the penalties and costs on Lot 4, Block 6, Morningside Court, as set forth in the petition of the Veteran's Welfare Board. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

AMENDMENT TO DOG LICENSE ORDINANCE:

An Ordinance prohibiting dogs in places where merchandise or food-stuffs are sold or exposed for sale, etc. was presented for first reading and was read.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, a change in the present lighting agreement between the Town and the P.G. & E. was ordered. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

Councilman Fusselman not voting.

Before adjourning, the Council, still sitting as a Board of Equalization, ordered reductions on the assessments of the American Trust Co., Mrs. I. B. Wilson, Linda Vista Tract, Margaret Smyth and E. Menzel in Sequoia Park, totaling \$6200 valuation.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Friday, August 31st, 1934, at 8 o'clock P.M.
