AMENDMENT TO DOG LICENSE ORDINANCE NO. 227:

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, an Ordinance prohibiting dogs in places where merchandise or foodstuffs are sold or exposed for sale, and on streets or sidewalks where merchandise or foodstuffs are being loaded or unloaded and regulating the keeping of dangerous or vicious dogs was presented for final reading and adoption. Motion to adopt said Ordinance was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 7TH, 1934.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Friday, September 7th, 1934, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: None.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meetings of August 28th and 31st, 1934 were approved and read.

BIDS FOR REMOVAL OF TREES:

A bid in the sum of \$140.00, including bond, was received from Caesar Cabella, of Kentfield, and placed on file. A check of the

several bids called for and received revealed that the bid of Carl Lezzeni and A. McAdam for such work is the lowest. It was agreed that no award of the contract would be made until the Superintendent of Streets returned from his vacation, at which time he will take the matter up with the Street Committee for consideration.

A petition bearing the signatures of A.J. Milligan and others along The Alameda, for the creation of a Sanitary District and building of storm drains, culverts, etc. was received and presented to the Council for consideration. Mr. Perry and Mr. Hoppe gave a rough outline of present conditions and tentative plans and estimates of such undertaking. Ben and John Mani and Mrs. Roux voiced their protests against such improvement at this time, fearing the costs, together with existing street work which might prove too burdensome. It was agreed that the entire Council would view the territory and after due consideration, if found necessary and not too expensive, proceedings would be started for the project.

Mr. Williams, representative of the Pacific Tel. & Tel. Co., asked permission to do certain tree trimming in order to clear their wires in town, and was advised by the Council that such work should be handled by tree experts, such as the Davey Tree Co., who does similar work for the Pacific Gas & Electric Co. under the supervision of trained men, who in turn must co-operate with the Superintendent of Streets.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the salary of Ambrose Ferrario, as Assistant Fire Chief, was raised from \$140. to \$160. for the months of September and October and thereafter until further notice the regular salary of such employee shall be \$150. per month; also that the salary of Officer Vickery be raised from \$150. to \$170. for the months of September and October, 1934, and that thereafter until further notice his regular salary shall be \$160. per month. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

The Clerk was asked to again write the City of Fairfax for their views on the Contractor's reciprocity agreement, requesting that the communication this time be addressed to Mr. Blagg, the Chairman of the Committee, under whose direction such matter will be handled.

The City Attorney stated that he or his representative ~~the~~ ~~Attorney General's Office~~, residing in Marin Co., will be present at the next meeting of the N.W.P.R.R.Co. and the Railroad Commission, in connection with the Railroad Company's petition for rate increase to be held in San Rafael

on September 25th, 1934.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, the Clerk was instructed to communicate with S.E.R.A. headquarters, with the view to furnishing the Council with all necessary blank forms to be used in connection with the Town project of clearing out the Creek within the corporate limits of the Town, said blanks to be on hand at the next meeting of the Council on September 21st.

Mr. Quinn, representing the Little Oil Burner Co. of San Rafael, asked Council to make certain changes in the present ordinance in connection with fuel tank installations, etc. After some discussion the matter was referred to the Fire Committee for investigation, it being understood that such change will in no way affect the present insurance rates.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, the firm of R.A. Carey & Co. will supervise the matter of Town Insurance with the usual provision of dividing commissions with Kent & Minto, Farrington L. Jones, Lang Realty Co., Leach Realty Co. and Pierce Realty Co., also such others as may qualify in said line during the present fiscal year. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:
