MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 21, 1934.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Friday, September 21, 1934 at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: None.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

A second bid of Mr. Durante for removal of trees was received and placed on file.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis all bids received to date by the Clerk for removal of certain trees on Sequoia Drive and Red Hill Ave. were rejected and the Superintendent of Streets was instructed to call for new sealed bids covering such work on October 9th. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Several communications received from Bashful Smith, 525 Market St., San Francisco, were read and placed on file and the matter of having Mr. Manley return certain tracings or prints of various subdivisions purported to be property of the Town was referred to the City Attorney.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the President of the City Council was authorized and empowered to act in all matters pertaining to S.E.R.A. project in San Anselmo and to sign any and all documents in connection therewith.

Councilman DosReis introduced the following resolution and mov-

ed its adoption:

"RESOLVED by the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo that that portion of Red Hill Avenue and Sir Francis Drake Boulevard lying between the easterly line of Ancha Vista Avenue and a point approximately one hundred (100) feet northerly of San Francisco Boulevard be improved in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor approved by the California Highway Commission, the Director of Public Works and the Department of Public Works of the State of California, and on file in the office of the City Clerk of said Town of San Anselmo; and

RESOLVED FURTHER that said improvement be paid for out of funds contributed therefor by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marin and out of moneys allocated therefor to said Town from the State Highway fund in accordance with law; and

RESOLVED FURTHER that said City Council, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 307 of the Statutes of 1931, has ascertained and hereby declares the general prevailing rates of per diem wages in the locality in which said work is to be performed, for each craft or type of workman or mechanic applicable to the work to be done and needed to execute the same and the contract therefor, are as set forth and stated in the "Notice to Contractors" hereto attached and made a part of this Resolution and to be published as herein directed; and

RESOLVED FURTHER that the City Clerk is hereby directed to cause to be published twice in the Marin Herald, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in said Town of San Anselmo a copy of the "Notice to Contractors" hereto attached calling for bids for the doing of said work, which said Notice is hereby approved and adopted for that purpose".

Motion to adopt said Resolution was made by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

The Engineer requested that the Clerk furnish him with several certified copies of all proceedings in connection with the improvement of Sir Francis Drake Blvd. and Red Hill Ave.

A petition, signed by Benj. F. White and others, protesting the granting of a permit for the erection and maintenance of a service station or auto camp on Lots 5 and 6 of Yolanda Park, was read and placed on file. No petition for such permit having been filed, no action was taken by the Council.

The communication of Dr. Thos. V. Smyth, calling Council's attention to the fact that a collection of debris, dirt, etc. was accumulating in his neighborhood in Sequoia Park, and praying for relief, was read and referred to the Street Committee for investigation and the Clerk was instructed to so advise the writer.

Mr. Gerlack addressed the Council in connection with deeding a certain strip of land to the Town for a roadway and the Town abandoning easement rights through his property. He was informed that the Councilmen, as a whole, would view the property and insist upon the payment of the remaining street assessments levied against such property before taking further action.

The matter of placing a "Slow" sign at the intersection of Hazel Ave. and San Anselmo Ave. was referred to the Police Committee for recommendation and further action.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, October 9th, 1934, at 8 o'clock P.M.

MINUTES OF OCTOBER 9TH, 1934.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, October 9th, 1934, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Lynch and Fusselman.

Absent: None.

Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of September 21st were approved as read.

This being the time and place set by the Council for the reception of bids on the work to be done on Sir Francis Drake Blvd. and Red Hill Ave., the Clerk reported the following bids received:

Said bids were referred to the Engineer for checking before awarding the contract. The Engineer suggested that the several bids be checked and O.K'd. by the State Board of Public Works before awarding the contract after which he would return same to the Clerk before the next meeting. The Engineer requested that the certified check accompanying the bid of A. J. Raisch be returned to the bidder.

The petition of the owner of Lots 5 and 6, Yolanda Park, and thirty or more residents in the immediate neighborhood, requesting that said property be rezoned, was read and referred to the Clerk for checking holdings of petitioners.

A letter from Geo. W. Manley claiming that the Town has no legal claim upon the tracings and blueprints now in possession of the Bashful Smith Printing Co. and that said property was his own, was read and after some discussion, upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the City Attorney was authorized to institute legal proceedings against Mr. Manley for the return of such tracings and blueprints.

A communication, signed City Clerk of Fairfax, advising Council that the Fairfax City Council agrees to recognize all licenses issued to contractors in San Anselmo was read and the Clerk was instructed to deliver the communication to the Tax Collector for his files.

A communication signed Aileen Carlisle protesting the removal of certain street lights in the vicinity of 74 Forest Ave. was read and
