MINUTES OF OCTOBER 9TH, 1934.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, October 9th, 1934, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.

Absent: None.

Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of September 21st were approved as read.

This being the time and place set by the Council for the reception of bids on the work to be done on Sir Francis Drake Blvd. and Red Hill Ave., the Clerk reported the following bids received:

E. Ford, San Anselmo.....	\$ 6040.00

Mr. Emmel, Berkeley.....	6426.00
A.J.Raisch, San Francisco.....	6437.00

Said bids were referred to the Engineer for checking before awarding the contract. The Engineer suggested that the several bids be checked and O.K'd. by the State Board of Public Works before awarding the contract after which he would return same to the Clerk before the next meeting. The Engineer requested that the certified check accompanying the bid of A. J. Raisch be returned to the bidder.

The petition of the owner of Lots 5 and 6, Yolanda Park, and thirty or more residents in the immediate neighborhood, requesting that said property be rezoned, was read and referred to the Clerk for checking holdings of petitioners.

A letter from Geo. W. Manley claiming that the Town has no legal claim upon the tracings and blueprints now in possession of the Bashful Smith Printing Co. and that said property was his own, was read and after some discussion, upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the City Attorney was authorized to institute legal proceedings against Mr. Manley for the return of such tracings and blueprints.

A communication, signed City Clerk of Fairfax, advising Council that the Fairfax City Council agrees to recognize all licenses issued to contractors in San Anselmo was read and the Clerk was instructed to deliver the communication to the Tax Collector for his files.

A communication signed Aileen Carlisle protesting the removal of certain street lights in the vicinity of 74 Forest Ave. was read and

the Chairman of the Lighting Committee informed Council that lights in question have been ordered replaced.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, the City Attorney and Superintendent of Streets were instructed to jointly draw up the necessary deed from Florence Eule to the Town, conveying a portion of Lot 135 Ross Valley Park, for the purpose of minimizing traffic accidents at the corner of Hazel and San Anselmo Aves. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dos Reis and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Written protests were received from the Marin Garden Club and Ethel Tompkins, against Council granting permission for the removal of trees on Red Hill Ave. opposite the Drive In Market as well as those along Sequoia Drive. The letters were placed on file and no action taken by the Council.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, permission was granted the local post of the American Legion to gravel the roadway leading from San Francisco Blvd. to the Legion Clubhouse, as requested in a communication dated October 9th, signed Ray Greenberg, Commander. The Clerk was instructed to so notify the writer. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Following are the sealed bids for the removal of three cypress trees along Sequoia Drive:

S.H. McCormick, San Anselmo.....\$45.00, plus \$10.00 cost for property damage and public liability insurance - wood to be claimed by bidder.

Louis Durante, Glen Park Ave., San Rafael...\$70.00, including cost of property damage and public liability insurance, or \$50.00 for topping the trees 20 feet from ground.

No further action was taken by the Council.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, the bid of the Shell Oil Co. to furnish the Town gasoline for a period of ninety days, at quoted price, was accepted. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

The matter of re-zoning property at El Centro Market was laid over until the next meeting of the Council and the Clerk was instructed to check names on the re-zoning petition.

The report of the Building Inspector for the month of September was received and placed on file.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, residents along the Alameda, within the boundaries of a recently petitioned for Sanitary District, are granted permission to install and use septic tanks, the type of which must meet the requirements of the local Health Officer. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Council agreed to postpone the matter of the acceptance of a roadway in the vicinity of Mr. Gerlark's property - Oak Ave., until after the coming winter.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, the Attorney was instructed to look into the matter of collecting a franchise from the Pacific Gas & Electric Co. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilman Dempsey, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilman Scotford.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, the Superintendent of Streets was instructed to order the P.G. & E. Co. to replace all lights in the Town recently ordered taken out by the Chairman of the Lighting Committee. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Scotford, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilmen Dos Reis.
Councilman Dempsey not voting.

WARRANTS:

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, Warrants Nos. 832 to 892 were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Councilman Linch advised Dr. T.V. Smyth that he, as Chairman of the Street Committee, would view the territory near the entrance to Sequoia Park and make such recommendations to the Council as he deemed necessary to abate the nuisance referred to in the communication of Dr. Smyth read at the meeting of September 21st.

Colonel Jordan stated he would have no objection to moving his fence line back several feet in the vicinity of the several cypress trees growing in the sidewalk area at or near his garage, enabling pedestrians to pass to and fro without being obliged to use the street at said location. It was agreed not to remove the trees if the said plan could be satisfactorily arranged.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Wednesday, Oct. 10th, 1934, at 8 o'clock P.M. J. Brennan Clerk.
